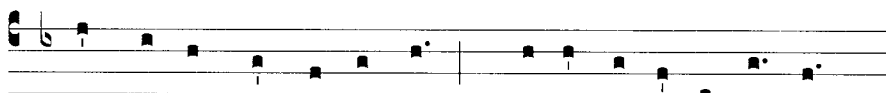
Please join in singing the hymn, which may be found on page 323 in the missalette.

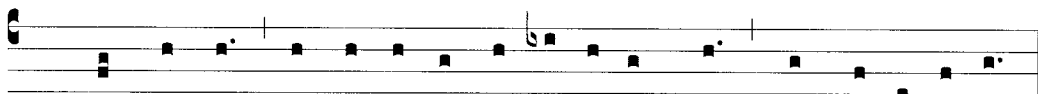

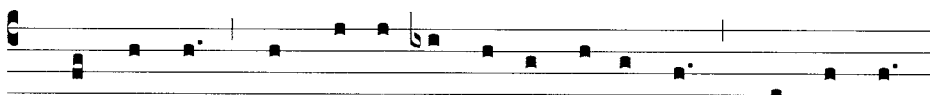
