ROSARY INITIATIVE FOR PRIESTS

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The very design of a church sanctuary should reflect the sacramental reality that, at the head of the church, something heavenly is happening. The nave (where the pews are) resembles a threshold between earth and heaven, the communion rail is the where the two touch, but the sanctuary is to resemble Heaven. St. Patrick's wonderfully accomplishes this in many ways. First, notice the large pointed arch over the altar. This is one of the few places where blue is used in our church, it is blue intermixed with white gothic tracery. This is a symbolic way of representing the clouds of this world parting (thin white tracery) and opening up for us the blue of Heaven. Framed within this arch are the frescoes representing our Lord and our patrons calling us to a heavenly way of life. On the ceiling is our celestial stained glass revealing the angels back-lit with the light from above, filtering down onto the altar where the Lord offers Himself for the salvation of His people. Everything about the sanctuary should make us think of heaven. After a generous donation from a donor, we have just polished our marble floor in the sanctuary. Not only did this project clean off decades of old wax and scuff marks, but it also brings a little more heavenly symbolism to our church. In the book of Revelation 4:6, St. John sees, "In front of the throne was something that resembled a sea of glass like crystal." Looking at the polished finish of our marble, you will immediately notice how reflective it is, much like a calm sea reflects the images around it. With this improvement, I am very grateful to our donor, and I hope that your experience of the Holy Mass is all the more heavenly! We are excited to explore a similar improvement at St. John the Baptist.

Please allow me to say a bit more about this coming Easter Triduum. As announced, St. Patrick's will offer both the Ordinary Form and Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite for the whole of the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil). This represents a significant change, but one that will provide generously for our parishioners and visitors. Our musicians have already started preparing and our altar servers are not far behind! Because celebrating both forms will require more volunteer involvement, I need to begin issuing my plea for more volunteers for this important time. If you are willing to be an usher, read, or serve at the altar for these liturgies, please contact me for scheduling. If you're willing to assist in setting up for our liturgical needs, I will be happy to share with you the times that our Altar Society plans to meet. In order for both forms of the liturgy to be fully provided for, we will need to increase the number of our volunteers. The Triduum is time for the greatest mysteries of our faith to be beautifully proclaimed, and crowds of the faithful rely on St. Patrick's for just that! Please consider assisting in that effort by reaching out to me at the parish office.

With the new Triduum arrangement, there is one element that needs a bit more explanation. Over the last 65 years, the Church has become accustomed to celebrating the Easter Vigil in the dark of night. But due to scheduling constraints, our EF Vigil will begin at 4pm. However, for many centuries, the Church did celebrate the Easter Vigil in the daytime. The basis for this has to do with the true notion of a "vigil." A vigil is a celebration in expectancy of something great, the vigil is not necessarily the apex of the celebration itself. This reality is reflected in the EF Easter Vigil by the fact that it begins in violet vestments, the change to white occurs when the Mass properly begins. But even this Vigil Mass of Easter is not the fullness of the Easter celebration, it is a foretaste of Easter from our generous Mother, the Church. To express this, the EF Easter Vigil Mass has no sequence, no offertory antiphon, nor *Agnus Dei* chant. In these, and other elements, the Church is both celebrating the Resurrection and restraining herself for the fullness of the feast in the coming morning. In this light, to celebrate the Easter Vigil in the daytime is not a foreign concept, but a way of expressing that our celebration of Easter is only just beginning! ~ Fr. O'Brien
