**ROSARY PRAYERS FOR THE
HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY**

All parishioners are invited to pray a Rosary on behalf of the Souls in Purgatory as often as possible during the year. This Rosary may be said for your dear departed family members, friends, or anyone, even those who are unknown to you, as you wish to include in this Act of Charity. Not only will you be performing a work of mercy for these souls, but they will pray for you! Sign-up sheets for 2020 are located on the table in the Narthex. Please choose any day, or multiple days, for which no one else has signed up. Thank you for sharing in this special gift to all the "Holy Souls in Purgatory".

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

I pray that your celebration of the season of Lent is off to a very blessed start! Today I continue my reflections on the Canon of the Mass. Finally, we arrive at the “institution narrative,” whereby we recall that moment our Lord first changed bread and wine into His flesh and blood. First, notice that these words are not a direct quotation of a biblical account of the Last Supper. Instead they are a composite of multiple accounts, including St. Paul’s. Next, notice the texts below; on the left is the Latin of the 1962 missal (the Extraordinary Form). On right is the text of the 2011 translation of the Ordinary Form Missal. You might notice slight differences that we made with the 1969 *Novus Ordo* “Ordinary Form” Missal. Much could be said about the rationale for these changes, but I’d prefer to reflect on the spiritual import of this moment.

Qui pridie quam pateretur, accepit panem in sanctas, ac venerabiles manus suas: et elevatis oculis in caelum ad te Deum Patrem suum omnipotentem, tibi gratias agens, benedixit, fregit, deditque discipulis suis, dicens: Accipite, et manducate ex hoc omnes. HOC EST ENIM CORPUS MEUM. Simili modo, postquam cenatum est, accipiens et hunc präclarum calicem in sanctas ac venerabiles manus suas, item tibi gratias agens benedixit, deditque discipulis suis, dicens: Accipite et bibite ex eo omnes: HIC EST ENIM CALIX SANGUINIS MEI, NOVI ET ÆTERNI TESTAMENTI: MYSTERIUM FIDEI: QUI PRO VOBIS ET PRO MULTIS EFFUNDETUR IN REMISSIONEM PECCATORUM. Haec quotiescumque feceritis, in mei memoriam facietis.

On the day before he was to suffer, he took bread in his holy and venerable hands, and with eyes raised to heaven to you, o God, his almighty Father, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying: TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took this precious chalice in his holy and venerable hands, and once more giving you thanks, he said the blessing and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying: TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.

In my own reflections, I’ve wondered what it means that these words are a *prayer*. At first glance, if someone were to hear these words for the first time, they might think someone is trying to tell a story, or reenact the Last Supper. But in the Mass, this is not a mere reenactment of the Last Supper. We know this because these words are not addressed to the people assembled, they are addressed to the Father through Christ, as we saw at the start of the Canon. This should remind us that these words are the sacramental representation of the whole of the passion of our Lord. For that reason the gesture of the priest at times does, and at times does not match the exact words of the text (i.e., the priest does not break the bread when the texts says “fregit”). Another reminder of this is the fact that priest speaks the words of consecration in the first person, saying, this is *my* body, *my* blood. At this moment, the priest is exercising the sacred power of his orders and acting *in persona Christi capitis*. It is no exaggeration to say that the priest is Christ, not symbolically, but sacramentally and really transforming the bread and wine into Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.

For the priest, these words, spoken in the first person, must remind him that what he celebrates at the altar, he must live out through the whole of his ministry. Christ’s act of perfect self-gift begun at the Last Supper and consummated on the Cross is to be made present most clearly at the Mass, and then again and again in the daily work of the priest. It is not only the priest whose life must be radically re-oriented by these words! All those who approach the Sacrament of Christ’s Flesh are then committed to a life of self-gift. Indeed, for all lay people, how frequent is the call to lay down your flesh and pour out your blood in works of charity? Next time your vocation imposes a demanding cross upon you, simply place upon your heart these sacred words, “This is my body.” -Fr. O’Brien
