Much has been said in recent weeks about the re-opening of schools. Many families have a difficult time imagining life without their routine of on-campus schooling and the community that naturally comes about from that environment. There are no easy decisions in this time of pandemic, but we cannot help but take special note of the way our lives are shaped by the task of education. Of course, whether families choose the on-campus model or the home school model, one thing remains the same: the parents are the primary educators of their children. Whether they try to or not, a parent is always teaching their child by their words and acts, however subtle. Of course, it is a natural responsibility far too important to be left to chance.

One of my sincere hopes during the time of the health crisis is for parents to reexamine their involvement in their child's education. For all the changes and adaptations we have had to endure during the pandemic, we cannot doubt that God's power is at work to bring good from our struggles. May His grace work powerfully in us that we may not neglect the sacred duty to educate our children! This education of our young is not a duty that can entirely be delegated to another. Whether math or science, reading or religion, a child's parents will always have a primary role to play in the formation of the mind.

The Second Vatican Council dedicated one of its 16 documents to the theme of education. *Gravissimum educationis* reiterates this sacred duty and summarizes the many magisterial teachings from recent centuries that highlight the importance of Christian education and the role of parents. St. John Paul II encouraged parents with a particular insight, so that they might never feel overwhelmed by this weighty responsibility. In his *Letter to Families*, he wrote, "Parents are the first and most important educators of their own children, and they also possess a fundamental competence in this area: they are educators because they are parents" (emphasis original). It takes no special training for a parent to be equipped as an educator, instead, John Paul says that because they are parents, endowed as they are with the sacramental graces of Marriage, Baptism and the Eucharist, they have been given by God what is necessary for this task.

By the fact that I am emphasizing the primary role of parents as their child's educators, I also emphasize my role, as the spiritual father to the parents of our parish, to educate our parishioners. Educating our young, particularly in matters of faith must be a task in which parents are well supported and encouraged. Our parish has not had a parish school since the 1930's and we have not yet been able to offer a full parish catechetical program. However, this year, I am excited to take the first steps toward the necessary goal of offering parish catechesis. The parish has a duty to form not only our children but adults, as well. For that reason, Mrs. Coote and I have been examining multiple models of catechesis that benefit the whole family and foster the family's role without replacing it.

Our steps toward achieving a full parish catechetical program will be modest at first. I sincerely desire to create a program that will be well received and helpful to parents to the maximum extent. This year, we will offer a more complete preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. We also have other ideas to pilot for willing participants. My consulting for this goal has been very broad so far, and for that reason, I am truly relying on your input and feedback. Whatever your state in life, our parish should have something to offer you in addition to the Holy Mass for your catechetical formation.

The recent events in our world could be cause for great alarm. However, the supernatural virtue of hope is uniquely ours as Christians. Being well prepared to meet the opposition of the world is a task with new urgency, and it is a task for which this parish aims to prepare you! ~Fr. O'Brien



Sixth Annual Fête-Dieu du Teche 40-mile Eucharistic Boat Procession to be held in petition to God for an end of the COVID-19 pandemic

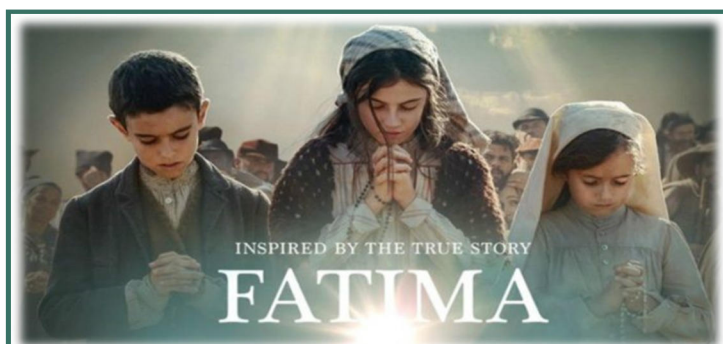
Fête-Dieu du Teche 2020 to take place Saturday August 15.

This year's unique 40-mile Eucharistic Procession by boat and foot will be offered in petition for an end of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The date is important for Roman Catholics as it is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Patroness of the Acadian people and of Acadiana. It is also a day that marks the 255th anniversary of the arrival of French-Canadian immigrants who brought the Catholic faith to Acadiana after enduring great trials and suffering. Fr. Michael Champagne, CJC, organizer of the event, notes that "having a Eucharistic Procession by boat on the waters of the Teche rather than by foot in the streets makes a lot of sense. Fête-Dieu du Teche on the Feast of the Assumption recalls our rich Acadian history and, in a way, re-enacts the journey made by the Acadians over 250 years ago."

Pope Francis, through his Grand Penitentiary, His Eminence Cardinal Mauro Piacenza, has granted a plenary indulgence to participants of *Fête-Dieu du Teche* on August 15, 2020. The indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly participate in the opening Mass at St. Leo the Great in Leonville, to those making the procession by boat down the Teche, and to those who participate at the various stations along the bayou in the recitation of the Marian Rosary and Benediction. This is indeed a sacred privilege!
