Servite Dominum in Timore

Just before the lock-downs, I was in the middle of my series of reflections on the Canon of the Mass. The pandemic has rightly been consuming our attention for these past several months. At the same time, we remember that our faith places heavenly things on our minds. Many thoughts and insights can be shared about what the pandemic has revealed to us. I truly hope you've been able to dialog with others even if they have a differing point of view than yours. But, so that we may not loose focus of the heavenly realities of our faith, today I invite you to ponder the prayer that immediately follows the prayers of consecration.

servi tui, sed et plebs tua sancta, celebrate the memorial of the eiusdem Christi, Filii tui, Domini blessed Passion, the Resurrection nostri, tam beatæ passionis, from the dead, and the glorious necnon et ab inferis Ascension into heaven of Christ, resurrectionis, sed et in cælos your Son, our Lord, we, your gloriosæ ascensionis: offerimus servants and your holy people, præclaræ maiestati tuæ de tuis offer to your glorious majesty donis ac datis hostiam puram, from the gifts that you have hostiam sanctam, hostiam given us, this pure victim, this immaculatam, Panem sanctum holy victim, this spotless victim, vitæ æternæ et Calicem salutis the holy Bread of eternal life and perpetuæ.

Unde et memores, Domine, nos Therefore, O Lord, as we the Chalice of everlasting salvation.

To begin, recall the context. We lowly creatures of the most High God have been begging and pleading with God for His mercy and His blessings upon the Church and the world. We have been telling Him about the "spotless offering" that we bring to Him, though it is meager bread and wine. Then, at the moment that God Himself changes that meager offering into the incomparable treasure of His own Son's Body and Blood, we pray this prayer the "Unde et memores."

You might think of this moment as a truly pivotal one since it is the first prayer we utter once that the Body of our Lord is on our altar. It recalls that moment in the life of Christ when Jesus first appeared to His disciples in the upper room after the Resurrection, and his first words, "Peace be with you." It is like that moment when two intimate friends finally reunite after a harrowing ordeal or a months-long journey-the first words mean the most.

With the gravity of this moment in mind, let us now examine just what is uttered by the prayer of the Church at this sacred moment. First, we recall that, at this altar, we are celebrating all the merits of Christ: His Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension. And in light of all the reasons that the Father should look favorably on His Son, we "offer." This verb is especially vital-it is the only verb in the whole prayer. In fact, I would even propose that this word summarizes the whole the sacred action of the Mass. What is the Mass? The Mass is our offering to God-first because He is worthy of our worship, and second because by this offering we are restored to a place of good standing before God. If we have such a treasure at our fingers, then we are enabled to enter into a divine exchange, a holy commerce with God. The prayer makes it clear that what we offer to God is no longer the fruit of human labor, but now It is God, Himself. We offer "this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim..." Offering a victim connotes a sacrifice, even one who has suffered a violence. Making this element explicit is aimed at stirring the heart of our Father to recall all the love that Christ poured out in His perfect act of obedience, and thereby healing our disobedience and opening our salvation. The perfect oblation on our altar is both an allsufficient offering to move the heart of God, it is also a gift of unspeakable generosity before which we must be moved to awe and gratitude. ~ Fr.
