



 **SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE**

After a restful vacation, I'm happy to be back with you all at God's altar. I'm so grateful to Fr. Melcher and the other priests who filled in for me to provide for our parish's sacramental needs while I was away. May God reward them! The reorganization of the archdiocese has delayed my publication of our parish's annual financial report, but I hope to have it ready by the middle of September. Particularly, during the hardships of the pandemic; I'd like to, again, express my sincere gratitude to all those who have continued to be generous to our parish collections during this time. Your dedication is a vivid reminder of God's goodness!


Allow me to continue my reflections on the Roman Canon with the 2nd prayer which follow the consecration:

Supra quæ propitio ac sereno	Be pleased to look upon these
vultu respicere digneris: et accepta	offerings with a serene and kindly
habere, sicuti accepta habere	countenance, and to accept them,
dignatus es munera pueri tui iusti	as once you were pleased to
Abel, et sacrificium Patriarchæ	accept the gifts of your servant
nostri Abrahæ, et quod tibi obtulit	Abel the just, the sacrifice of
summus sacerdos tuus Abrahæ,	our father in faith, and
Melchisedech, sanctum	the offering of your high priest
sacrificium, immaculatam	Melchizedek, a holy sacrifice, a
hostiam.	spotless victim.

As I mentioned in my last reflection about the prayer following the consecration, the *Unde et memores* recalls all the merits of Christ and then explicitly connects the Sacrament of the Altar to the power Christ's self-oblation. Continuing that same theme, the *Supra quæ*, recalls that making an offering to God has been the activity of God's people ever since the beginning. Abel, of course, was the son of Adam and Eve whose offering to God was the choice portion of his flock. The animal sacrifice of Abel prefigures the immolation of First Born of All Creation, Jesus Christ. God favored Abel's offering because, unlike Cain's, it was made generously from the first fruits. This favor of God sparked Cain's jealousy and resulted in fratricide. The patriarch Abraham made several offerings to God, but his most notable was his willingness to sacrifice his only son at God's command. We know that God held back Abraham's hand at the last moment, but gave this instruction to Abraham so that he may prove his righteousness. Abraham's loving obedience to God is a prefiguration of our Heavenly Father's kindness in offering His only Son for our salvation. The offering of Melchizedek is a hallmark of the Old Testament and is shrouded in mystery. Melchizedek's origins are unknown, but when he appears, he comes as a priest offering bread and wine to God. He prefigures Christ both in his mysterious priestly origins and in the fact that Christ offered bread and wine to God making it His Body and Blood.

Just as the *Unde et memores* recalls the merits of Christ as we make our offering to the Father, so too does the *Supra quæ* recall the deeds of the Old Testament beseeching the Father's favor. These two prayers, then, give us the whole picture: the true essence of Judeo-Christian worship is that we should make an offering to God. In the Old Testament, that offering was there mere work of our own sinful hands. But now, in Christ, we can make an offering to God far beyond our own capacity. For this reason, we stand audaciously, but confidently before the Father to ask for His favor upon us.

The emphasis upon offering and sacrifice that we see in the Canon is a much needed reminder to us that the purpose of the Mass (and of a life of spirituality in general) is not primarily to receive from God. Rather, in imitation of the life of Christ, the apex of our life of faith is to unite ourselves to Christ and make ourselves an offering to God. Such a surrender to the Most High is the most liberating act of love we can undertake. It is exemplified for us by Christ, and it will be the unending joy of the saved in eternal life. ~ Fr. O'Brien


