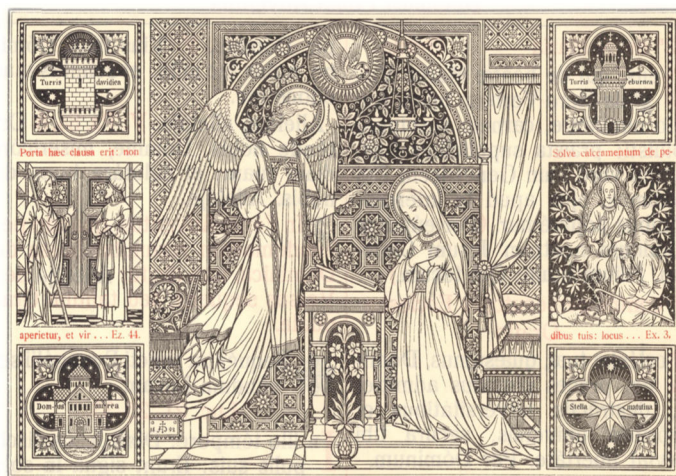

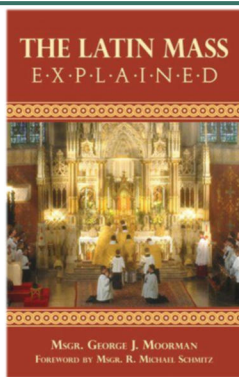
- We are still dispensed from Sunday Mass obligation, so if you are compromised in any way, feel ill or have been in contact with someone who has been ill, please stay home.

Just as the month of June is set apart in a special way to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus, so too is August dedicated to our Lady's Immaculate Heart. The reason for this is that August 22nd is designated as the feast of the Immaculate Heart in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Calendar. In the Ordinary Form, the feast of the Immaculate Heart occurs on the Saturday after the solemnity of the Sacred Heart in June. Moreover, as often as the liturgical calendar allows, we celebrate a Mass in honor of the Immaculate Heart on first Saturdays.

Honoring the heart of our Lady is a particular kind of Marian devotion. In this devotion we direct attention to the physical heart of the Blessed Mother. This devotion is possible because, as the Church teaches infallibly, our Lady has already been assumed into heaven, body and soul. Because of this, the very heart of our Lady is already glorified with Christ in heaven. But even deeper, this devotion also helps us to ponder what the heart symbolizes. In our Lady, her heart reminds us of her rich interior life, her joys and sorrows, her preservation from all sin, her pure love for her divine Son and all her children below. Just as the human person is both soul and body, similarly, devotion to the Heart of Mary honors both her physical glorified heart and her perfect interior life of devotion.

While devotion to the hearts of Jesus and Mary are similar, they differ as well. The goal of Marian devotion is to increase the honor, love and worship we render to the Most Holy Trinity. Therefore our devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is aimed at worship, whereas our devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is aimed at honor, study and imitation.

Devotion to our Lady's Immaculate Heart can be traced all the way back to the time when scripture when, upon the cross, our Lord entrusted Mary to St. John, and through him, she is entrusted to all of us. Earlier in the life of Christ, Simeon foretold that her heart would be pierced with a sword. This prophecy was ultimately fulfilled when our sorrowful mother displayed perfect compassion with Christ as He carried His cross. Her participation in our Lord's passion was not as a mere spectator. But just as a mother's heart is united with her child, so too, in a perfect way, our Lady truly participated in Christ's perfect love as she stood by the side of her Son. Deeply considering the dispositions and interior experiences of our Lady throughout her life can be rich food for our own meditation. In doing so, we are imitating the very interior life of our Lady. For, St. Luke tells us that she observed the mysterious events our Lord's childhood and reflected "on them in her heart." (2:19)

Historically speaking, devotion to the heart of Mary can be seen as early as the 12th century in the writings of St. Bernard. Both active and contemplative saints lauded the heart of Mary as a true model of virginity and interiority, and therefore complete love for God. Later, the devotion was developed by St. Bernardine of Siena and St. Francis de Sales. St. John Eudes was the first to be granted a local liturgical celebration of the Immaculate Heart and from there the feast spread to the Church universal in more recent times. Let us worship our God for the work of His grace that we witness in the Immaculate Heart of Mary! ~ Fr. O'Brien



Sixth Annual Fête-Dieu du Teche

40-mile Eucharistic Boat Procession to be held in petition to God for an end of the COVID-19 pandemic

Fête-Dieu du Teche 2020 to take place Saturday August 15.

This year's unique 40-mile Eucharistic Procession by boat and foot will be offered in petition for an end of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The date is important for Roman Catholics as it is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Patroness of the Acadian people and of Acadiana. It is also a day that marks the 255th anniversary of the arrival of French-Canadian immigrants who brought the Catholic faith to Acadiana after enduring great trials and suffering. Fr. Michael Champagne, CJC, organizer of the event, notes that "having a Eucharistic Procession by boat on the waters of the Teche rather than by foot in the streets makes a lot of sense. Fête-Dieu du Teche on the Feast of the Assumption recalls our rich Acadian history and, in a way, re-enacts the journey made by the Acadians over 250 years ago."

Pope Francis, through his Grand Penitentiary, His Eminence Cardinal Mauro Piacenza, has granted a plenary indulgence to participants of **Fête- Dieu du Teche** on August 15, 2020. The indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly participate in the opening Mass at St. Leo the Great in Leonville, to those making the procession by boat down the Teche, and to those who participate at the various stations along the bayou in the recitation of the Marian Rosary and Benediction. This is indeed a sacred privilege!
