SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

With the financial reports nearly completed, I look forward to sharing those with you next week. I am very grateful to our parish Men's Club, the St. Joseph Guild, for sponsoring the speaker who addressed emergency situations which could potentially occur in church. Men from both St. Patrick's and St. John the Baptist were able to attend. Secondly, our parish book study is off to a good start. Thanks again to Mr. Anthony Bueche for sharing his expertise!

This week I'd like to continue my series on the Roman Canon. The prayer that I will examine below has a very unique rubric attached to it. The rubric instructs the priest to bow profoundly with his hands joined on the altar. In that posture, he prays:

nostrum. Amen.

Supplices te rogamus, In humble prayer we ask you, omnipotens Deus: iube hæc almighty God: command that perferri per manus sancti Angeli these gifts be borne by the hands tui in sublime altare tuum, in of your holy Angel to your altar conspectu divinæ maiestatis tuæ: on high in the sight of your ut, quotquot ex hac altaris divine majesty, so that all of us, participatione sacrosanctum Filii who through this participation at tui Corpus et Sanguinem the altar receive the most holy sumpserimus, omni benedictione Body and Blood of your Son, cælesti et gratia repleamur. Per may be filled with every grace eundem Christum Dominum and heavenly blessing. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us remember the context. The consecration occurred just a moment ago. Right after that most sacred moment, the priest invoked the merits of Christ and offered the oblation to the Father (Unde et memores). He then recalled the fact that God's people have been making sacrifices to Him since the beginning (Supra quae). Now, today's prayer, the Supplices, makes a very bold request. Since we too offer sacrifice, and since our sacrifice is the same one made by Christ, we ask God that our sacrifice would be lifted up to Him.

Nothing we could say or do would make God bound to our request. For that reason, we begin the Supplices with a word of humility. Then we ask God to summon His authority to do what once was impossible—to bridge the gap between God and man. Sin has divided us, but in this moment we beseech the Lord that what is occurring upon our altar may be transported before the face of God. This mysterious transposition has two meanings. First, that what we offer to God may ascend so high as to be looked upon with favor by God. Secondly, that the perpetual offering of Christ Himself before the Father may be the very offering to which our sacrifice conforms. In other words, in this prayer, we are asking that the sacrifice on our altar may be nothing less than the one continuous offering that Christ makes at Calvary and in heaven for the salvation of man. We are praying that the perfect exchange of love which is interior to the Most Holy Trinity may be shown forth by the offering we make upon our altar. This notion truly is worthy of profound meditation!

Notice that the word Angel is capitalized. St. Thomas Aquinas proposes that the Angel entrusted with the task of bring our sacrifice to God is none other than Christ Himself. He is, therefore, both the Priest who brings the sacrifice to God, as well as the Sacrifice, Itself. Having the one perfect sacrifice to argue on our behalf before God, we continue our audacious request: to be "filled with every grace and heavenly blessing. Who are we to request anything from God? And yet, because of Christ, we are able to ask for the full outpouring of heaven to be upon us! Finally, for the first time since the consecration, the prayer concludes with "Through Christ our Lord. Amen." Notice, the Canon has not concluded but we are invoking Christ. This is not mere repetition, but serves as a way to signal that a change is coming. In other words, a shifting from one notion to another is coming. This conclusion effectively unites all three prayers that we just offered following the consecration. ~ Fr. O'Brien
