SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

We're nearing the end of my series of reflections on the Roman Canon. Today, we pick up among the prayers after the consecration. Right after the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, the Church recalls all the merits of Christ and, in His name, offers the divine Oblation to the Father (Unde et memores). Then we invoke the whole history of God's people and the unbroken chain of sacrifices offered to God since the beginning; these are now fulfilled in Christ (Supra quae). Next we draw God's attention to the offering on our altar and beg that It would be transported into Heaven itself where our Sacrifice is truly joined to the eternal offering of Christ to the Father (Supplices Te rogamus).

The three prayers I just mentioned are formed into a literary whole by the fact that only the last of these three concludes with, "Through Christ our Lord. Amen." With such a conclusion, the aim of our prayers shifts gears from offering to petitioning. The two prayers below move back to supplication as we seek to obtain grace for the dead and for ourselves.

Nobis quoque peccatoribus, famulis To us, also, your servants, who, tuis, de multitudine miserationum though sinners, hope in your tuarum sperantibus, partem aliquam et abundant mercies, graciously societatem donare digneris, cum tuis grant some share and fellowship sanctis Apostolis et Martyribus: cum with your holy Apostles and Ioanne, Stephano, Matthia, Barnaba, Martyrs: with John the Baptist, Ignatio, Alexandro, Marcellino, Petro, Stephen, Matthias, Barnabas, Felicitate, Perpetua, Agatha, Lucia, Ignatius, Alexander, Marcellinus, Agnete, Cæcilia, Anastasia et omnibus Peter, Felicity, Perpetua, Agatha, Sanctis tuis: intra quorum nos Lucy, Agnes, Cecilia, Anastasia consortium, non æstimator meriti, sed and all your Saints; admit us, we veniae, quæsumus, largitor admitte. Per beseech you, into their company, not weighing our merits, but granting us your pardon, through Christ our Lord.

The Memento of the dead reflects the Memento of the living which occurs before the consecration. Both are set apart by a gesture in which the priest joins his hands, bows his head and prays privately for particular individuals. You may also notice the MC or the deacon step to the left to give the priest an added measure of privacy during this moment of intercession. The Nobis quoque peccatoribis is distinguished from the other prayers of the Canon in the 1962 missal because the first three words are said aloud. The raising of the voice recalls the speech of the good thief who prays that Christ would remember Him. We too have just witnessed the passion of Christ sacramentally present on the altar, therefore we too raise our voice to entreat Him. This is the last prayer of supplication and in it, we pray for ourselves. It is a sign of humility that we place others' petitions before our own needs; it is joined to the gesture of striking the breast to signify lowliness. When we pray for ourselves, we ask not for some merely earthly concern, but for a share with the saints. This list of saints invokes an Apostle (Barnabas), martyrs and Church doctors. To conclude, the Canon lists are seven women who exemplify the height of sanctify. All are martyrs, two in motherhood (Felicity and Perpetua) the others are virgin martyrs. By granting us His pardon, may we share in their glorious inheritance! ~Fr. O'Brien

Some of Dr. Kwasniewski's wonderful tips to enhancing proximate aids for 'Mass, especially Traditional Latin Mass, include attending High Mass when possible. Dr. Kwasniewski believes that although the liturgy might appear longer and more complex, there are also engaging activities for children to observe. Between the bows, processions, and incensations, it can be a feast for the senses - and let us not forget the music! He also believes investing in a reputable children's missal or an intermediate level missal (Kwasniewski himself has written one) can make the difference for children. He also encourages you and your family to stay after Mass to enjoy socializing with members of the congregation. A combination of all these efforts can be a crucial part of engagement, and eventually a deep love, for the Traditional Latin Mass.
