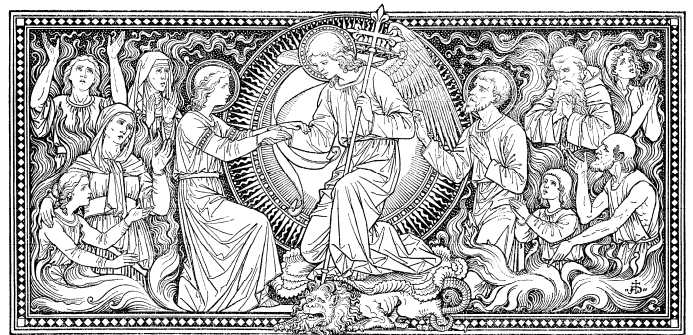

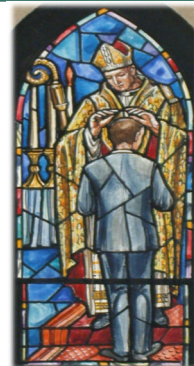

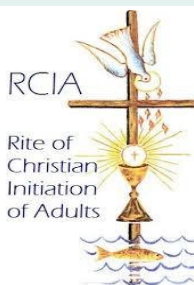

November ushers in for us, as Catholics, thoughts of the end times. Since the liturgical year starts anew with Advent, November is that month where the last things come to the surface in the texts of the liturgy. This is far from a somber observance! While death, judgement, heaven and hell are matter of utmost seriousness, so too must we view these things in the light of the hope that we have in Christ. Perhaps for that reason, our Mother, the Church, allows us to begin this “month of the last things” with the joyful and glorious recollection that the Saints, our brothers and sisters in Christ, are already enjoying the heavenly reward promised to the faithful. With this great encouragement to inspire our efforts, we can endeavor to complete the difficult reflections on our own death and judgement that will keep us rightly focused on God. In addition to rejoicing with all the saints, tomorrow we recommit ourselves to praying for the dead in purgatory. I hope that you can join us for the Solemn Mass St. Patrick’s will offer tomorrow at 6:30pm. As always, we owe a special debt of gratitude to Mr. Mills and our parish musicians for their hard work in preparing the 4 voice Victoria Mass for the occasion.

As November concludes our liturgical year, now is also a good time to conclude my reflections on the Roman Canon.

*Per quem hæc omnia, Domine, semper* Through whom you continue to  
*bona creas, sanctiꝑficas, viviꝑficas,* make all these good things, O  
*beneꝑdicis, et præstas nobis.* Lord; you sanctify them, fill them

*Per ipꝑsum, et cum ipꝑso, et in ipꝑso* Through him, and with him, and  
*so, est tibi Deo Patri ꝑ omnipotenti, in* in him, O God, almighty Father,  
*unitate Spiritus ꝑ Sancti, omnis honor* in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all  
*et gloria per omnia sæcula sæculorum.* glory and honor is yours, for ever  
*Amen.* and ever. Amen.

These are the final prayers of the Roman Canon. What begins next with the prayer of the Our Father is the preparation for receiving Holy Communion. First, notice that in the Roman Missal of 1962, 8 signs of the cross are made. These are not necessarily gestures of blessings—after all, what would a blessing add to the Real Presence of our Lord? But these are signs which remind us that the action of the Mass cannot be thought of apart from the cross. Indeed, the whole Mass is the sign of the cross, the priest himself is called to portray the sign of the cross in the Mass since he stands in the place of Christ, the head. Every Catholic is also called to show the world the mystery and the glory of the cross. Over the ages, each of these signs of the cross have taken on an allegorical meaning. St. Thomas Aquinas likens the first three of these signs of the cross to recall the final prayers of Christ upon the cross, “Father forgive them,” “Why hast thou forsaken me,” and “Into your hands I commend my spirit.” The next three recall the three hours that our Lord spent on the cross. The final two are unique because they are made while the priest holds the host, signing with It between the chalice and himself, as if to show a flowing from the chalice. These, then, signify the two sacred streams coming from the side of Christ after his death: blood and water.

In addition to the significance of the signs of the cross, the very content of these prayers are truly worthy of our meditation. The prayers convey the primacy of Christ—through Him God makes holy and gives new life. Christ is our only hope, there is no other! This work of God in Christ has a Trinitarian aim. The final prayer is clearly reechoing a theme that started the canon: our prayer is being united to Christ (our only hope) aided by the Holy Spirit as an offering to the Father for His honor and glory. The Mass unfolds the mission of Christ to put us in Communion with the Most Holy Trinity!
