



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Please take a moment to review the flyer inserted into the bulletin this week regarding the Advent Appeal. It shows the work that needs to be done on St. Patrick's exterior. Due to theses flaws, water has been able to penetrate the walls and windows causing damage to the interior plaster walls and ceiling. To address this problem, we have a contractor who will find the cracks, repair them, replace any delaminated stucco, re-seal the window frames, clean the exterior stucco, remove any vegetation, and repaint the louvers on our bell tower. This is a significant project, and with your support we can accomplish this goal for the preservation of our historic and sacred edifice.

St. John the Baptist is also in the midst of the Annual Appeal. The funds from this year's efforts will be applied to upgrading the existing A/C system. Donations made to this appeal will be matched up to \$20,000. Many thanks for the very kind St. John parishioner who is making this possible. As a result, please consider donating generously so we can take full advantage of this matching fund offer!

These appeals at both churches will be unassessed by the Archdiocese of New Orleans. This means that every penny given toward these appeals will be spent at the church. Your generosity, particularly during this time wrought with difficulties, is doubly appreciated. Our churches are no stranger to times of challenge! It brings me great comfort to recall the moments in St. Patrick's history when the present and the future looked bleak. However, with the resolve of the faithful and their zeal to hand on to the next generation what they had received, they found a way to continue honoring God in these four walls. May the Lord reward you for your generosity and bring good success to our efforts!

Some may be wondering about the chant which is used to conclude the Mass. As you may know, the Church directs us to not use the organ during Advent except to support the singing. Therefore, with no postlude, we have decided to end the Mass with the *Alma Redemptoris Mater*. This antiphon to our Lady is proper to the Advent and Christmas seasons. Liturgically, it concludes the office of compline in the Breviary. Please reflect on the translation below. ~ Fr. O'Brien

Alma Redemptóris Mater, quæ pérvia cæli Porta manes, et stella maris, succúrre cadénti, Súrgere qui curat pópulo: tu quæ genuísti, Natúra miránte, tuum sanctum Genitórem Virgo prius ac postérius, Gabriélis ab ore Sumens illud Ave, peccatórum miserére.

Loving Mother of the Redeemer, who remains the accessible Gateway of Heaven, and Star of the Sea, Give aid to a falling people that strives to rise;

O Thou who begot thy holy Creator, while all nature marveled,

Virgin before and after receiving that "Ave" from the mouth of Gabriel, have mercy on sinners.

FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

During Advent we should reflect on the history of salvation that led to the coming of the Messiah. For centuries God prepared His people for the Incarnation of His Son; often His people would rebel and reject Him, but God was always faithful to His promises. He would send kings and prophets and priests to turn the Israelites back to Him. Then finally, in the fullness of time, He sent His Son, born of a woman. Likewise, God is faithful to His promises today

and He is preparing us for glory in Heaven for eternity. Even when we turn from Him in rebellion, He pours out His grace in Baptism; He sends His Son to us in the appearance of bread and wine; he forgives us in the Sacrament of Confession. God comes to us. In this way, every day is an "Advent," as we open ourselves to His coming into our hearts today, but also await Christ's glorious and final coming at the End of Time. During this liturgical season of Advent, let us intensify our preparations for the coming of Christ to Eric Sammons



It can be difficult to fully imagine being present at the time Christ entered the world as a baby. I wonder what he looked like. I ponder what the Holy Family was doing in those early moments. How could this perfect babe save a lowly sinner like me? Mr. Sammons reminds us that when we are truly living a Sacramental life, Christ is always near and continually entering our hearts. His endless mercy transcends time. In return, we must go out and share the new light of Christ to all. Let His love be a reminder of what ours should look like. It should be gentle, humble, and waiting with arms open wide ready to receive the broken, desperate, and outcast, just as He first did for us.
