SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

“*Ad te levavi animam meam, Deus meus.*” With these words, the Church inaugurates a new liturgical year. These first words chanted in the introit, orient us toward God and remind us of our most fundamental duty: to raise up our souls to Him. In such an act of worship, we carry out a self-oblation by making of ourselves an offering to Him, Who alone is worthy. The First Sunday of Advent starts the new liturgical year and gives each of us a moment to look forward to new beginnings. Who would have thought, just one year ago, the unique challenges and, indeed, tragedies that 2020 had in store for us? So, perhaps with trepidation we stand on the threshold of this new year. No one can deny the uncertainty that lies ahead, but this is all the more reason for us to make a special effort to mark the start of this new liturgical cycle.

Looking back at 2020, so many elements of our lives were “new,” but yet uncomfortable. For this reason, it becomes clear again that “new” is not always “better.” And so what is the cause of our hope as we begin this new year in the sanctoral cycle? Marking the start of the liturgical year helps us to see that while what lies ahead of us is new, it is also familiar and time-tested. Our year as Christians is not merely marked with a cycle of months nor merely punctuated with occasional feasts. The liturgical year invites us into a year-long procession of seasons and it is rich in many sacred observations to remind us on a daily basis to keep our souls uplifted to God. If we are faithful to observe the seasons and feasts of the liturgical year, we are able to liturgically re-live the life of Christ. When the crosses of this world weigh heavy upon us, what greater consolation could we desire than to be so vividly reminded that our Lord, during His earthly life, has gone before us and walks with us still? Surely, this is a great cause of hope as we look ahead to this new liturgical year.

Truly, Advent is a time to lift up our souls in hope. It is also a time of anticipation. By the texts of the Mass, we are directed to lift our souls to God and to hear the voice of His prophets so that our expectation may be stirred up. And what we await does not disappoint! While this season of Advent begins with our action (lifting the soul to God), it culminates with a divine reciprocation (God offering Himself to us). This is the mystery that has reoriented all of creation, and so we must allow the Incarnation to have its sway in our daily lives.

This means that we do not look at the world the same way as the faithless. We certainly do not celebrate Christmas in the same way as our impatient secular counterparts. Christmas is able to shine a light that the world desperately desires, and that is shown in the way our culture decorates itself with Christmas trappings. But without preparation, these external observations can provide no more than momentary enjoyment. Therefore, allow me to encourage you to slow down this Advent. As we listen to the promises of God, note well the stark contrasts between them and the promises of the world. As we look forward to another repetition of the Church year, we do so with certitude that God has new insight to offer us for today's challenges. While experiencing the presence of family or friends may have changed in 2020, we can reflect on the presence of God-with-us with an entirely new clarity. May your Advent preparations be abundantly fruitful! ~ Fr. O'Brien
