

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

This week has been one for the record books at St. Patrick's! Following our successful Advent Appeal, progress is being made on several major projects on our campus. Waterproofing has started on the Girod Street side of the church, catwalk is being installed in the attic in preparation for the tower beam repair, and the fire alarm has been partially rewired to enable our renovation of the courtyard wall. Because most of you won't see it in person, I thought I'd share a photo of the work going on above St. Patrick's ceiling.



What happens in the attic is interesting, but what happens on the altar is altogether more important! As such, I will continue my reflections on the Eucharist as we observe this Year of the Eucharist. Continuing the theme of Old Testament precursors of the Eucharist, let's move on from Genesis and consider how God established the priesthood for His people as they left Egypt. At the time that they engaged in wrong worship (the idolatry of the golden calf), Moses selected the Levites to ensure right worship (Ex 32:26-29). This Levitical priesthood would offer sacrifices of all kinds to God including wheat and the flesh of animal sacrifices. The most central of these sacrifices was the *todab*. It was the Passover sacrifice of a lamb joined to a bread offering which occurred on the altar of the temple. The word *todab* is Hebrew for thanksgiving, similarly the Greek word Eucharist means thanksgiving. The *todab* was offered in gratitude for safe passage from slavery to life in the Promised Land. The Eucharist is a gift of God's grace for us to be delivered from sin so that we may be found worthy of eternal life.

Three biblical experiences of Old Testament prophets serve as signs of the coming blessing of the Eucharist. The prophet Elijah was forced to flee, and during his long journey, God sends him a jug of water and a hearth cake (1 Kgs 19). This small amount of food was enough for him to survive another 40 days without sustenance. At the end of his exile, then he famously encountered God in the whispering of the wind. In like manner, the Eucharist is just a small amount of food in earthly terms, but it sustains our souls and puts us in contact with God, who resides within us. Later, the prophet Isaiah has a mystical experience where he is instructed to consume a burning coal. From the altar of God, an angel brings Isaiah a coal for the specific purpose of removing Isaiah's sins (Is 7:6-7). Just so, the Eucharist is a gift from heaven which stirs a fire in a us. The fire of the Holy Spirit cleanses us from sin and moves us to act boldly in the name of the Gospel. Thirdly, at the outset of his prophetic mission, the prophet Ezekiel is asked to consume the scroll with God's word on it (Ez 2:8). This parallels our experience of the Mass because not only are we able to listen to God's Word (in the first half of Mass), but we are able to allow that Word to take up residence within us when we draw near to Holy Communion. By the Eucharist, we consume God's Word, Jesus Christ, and His indwelling equips us to know God and make Him known as prophets in our day.

We can become overwhelmed with the daily task of caring for our own family, that we forget to look to our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Lord Jesus, please open our eyes, soften our hearts. Help us meet the needs of your most vulnerable in our community. Help us to teach our families, especially little ones, to humbly serve You through them. We pray our families, bring glory and joy to Your name. We pray they strengthen our communities and shine a light to those who need it most. Amen
