

February 9th marked the 139th anniversary of the death of Margaret Haughey (HAW-a-ree). She is easily among the most notable of all St. Patrick's parishioners. She arrived in the United States from Ireland as a child. The journey and transition to life in the United States were fraught with trials and tragedies. Over the next several years, Margaret would lose all of her family members and become orphaned in Baltimore. Cared for by a sympathetic fellow Irishwoman, she married at the age of 21, but her new husband had ill health. A move to the warmer climate of New Orleans was intended to aid his condition, but their arrival coincided with a yellow fever outbreak. Her husband sought treatment in Ireland. However, once he finally arrived, he succumbed to his ailment. Their small daughter, Frances, also fell victim to health hazards of their day.



Margaret found herself widowed and alone at the age of 23. But rather than be defeated in her afflictions, she turned her life over to the service of orphans and widows. Whatever income she had, she donated to the Daughters of Charity and their efforts to care for orphans. Employed at a bakery, she gradually took over the business. It was then generously patronized by New Orleanians. She continued to use her proceeds to aid those in need. So successful was she that she was able to construct other orphanages for the city, also, St. Theresa Church. She became so beloved that she won the esteem of politicians and generals. News of her death made front-page headlines. Among her pall bearers were the governor of Louisiana and the Mayor of New Orleans. Her obituary contains a fascinating glimpse into St. Patrick's parish life from all those years ago. I've included it below.

May Margaret's life of selflessness inspires us to serve the Lord and serve others in all circumstances!

Upon arriving at St. Patrick's Church the pall bearers had great difficulty in bearing the remains through the centre aisle, owing to the dense throng of persons assembled. Not only was this aisle, but those to the right and left, the body of the church, and even the galleries thronged with people.

The funeral ceremonies were conducted by the Most Rev. Monsignor Allen, who celebrated requiem mass, with the Rev. Father Fitzgerald as deacon, and the Rev. Father Heslin as sub-deacon, Archbishop Perche reading the prayers after Mass, and the venerable Rev. Father Hubert closing the services with an eloquent sermon, choosing for his text the words of Margaret: "God has been good to me. I am His child. Let Him do to me as He may please."
