SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The moral issues of our day truly demand our attention, first, because of our duty to avoid evil, but second because of our duty to represent our beliefs in a way that modern man can understand them. For the last two weeks, I have presented a summary form of the Catholic understanding of the current COVID vaccines. Please feel free to bring to me your own thoughts and concerns! To conclude my presentation on this topic, I have just a few more words on the notion of proportionality. Recall from last week, that when it comes to the vaccines, the proportionality of good to evil has to do with the <u>circumstances</u> surrounding the vaccines. Remember, no proportionality of good and evil can turn an evil <u>act</u> or evil <u>intentions</u> into good. However, since taking a vaccine is a good moral act, then we must consider proportionality while assessing the circumstances.

Among the circumstances of the COVID vaccine, is the involvement of past abortion, as well as the potential for the vaccine to save a life. In order for the good circumstances to outweigh the bad circumstances these factors need to be carefully considered. Pertaining to the bad circumstance of this vaccine's connection to abortion recall that using this vaccine does not promote the continuation of abortion, since the cell lines are replicated by scientists. In other words, using the vaccines does not encourage future abortions to occur. However, the vaccine is also benefitting from the unjust failure to respect the remains of deceased human beings. The cells of the aborted, even if they are replicated in a lab, should be dignified by burial. In this sense, the vaccines are entangled in a past evil (abortion) and a present evil (injustice).

Compare this with the good to be obtained. For those who are healthy, the possibility of recovery from COVID even without a vaccine is very high, over 99%. For that reason, someone would easily conclude that the proportionate cause for taking the vaccine does not exist. However, according to the Louisiana Department of Health, the average person who died from COVID was in their mid 70's and 62% suffered from the comorbidity of hypertension. This is just one example of medical conditions that increase the risk of death if COVID is contracted. If one of these factors which makes death from COVID more possible, then the need for the vaccine is increased, and therefore, the good that the vaccine can do is increased.

We have been counseled by the leaders of the Church to take all these factors to our conscience. When we do so we can judge our circumstances and discern if the evil of abortion which is entangled with the vaccine is something we can tolerate in conscience.

Our times call for heroism. As each person discerns the moral analysis of taking the vaccine, may I urge you to look for ways to be proactive in the fight against the evils of our time. Top on that list is the taking of the life of the unborn. To wait for a vaccine that has no connection with abortion may be a risk for some. However, it is a risk worth considering! Changing shopping habits so as to avoid retailers who advance the abortion agenda is a way for us to be a sign of contradiction in our world. For who take the vaccine, maybe this is an especially good time to donate toward pro-life charities. So that the evil entwined in the vaccine may be counteracted by the initiative of love that we take upon ourselves as Christians. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, may this time be one in which our faith may shine brightly and the modern world may be attracted to the integrity and truth that directs our lives. ~Fr. O'Brien
