



## SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

On this glorious feast day of Corpus Christi, we rejoice in God's manifold gifts. First and foremost, for the gift of His real presence in the Eucharist. Also, for the joyful celebration of First Holy Communion for our parish children. I, personally, give thanks to God for the many ways that Eucharistic piety is alive and well in our parish. Such practices like visitors to the Eucharist during the daytime, dressing well for Mass, maintaining silence before and after Mass, spending time to pray in preparation before and in thanksgiving after Mass are all ways that we can display our love for the Eucharist. The greatest act of devotion among these, of course, is reverently receiving Holy Communion while free from grave sin and having lived the week prior in a manner befitting this divine gift!

In observance of the Year of the Eucharist, I'd like to continue today with my bulletin series on the scriptural foundations of our belief in Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. I've already brought passages to your attention from the Old and New Testaments. Today, it is fitting to examine more closely the passage found in John chapter 6. This lengthy series of lessons and miracles happens rather close to the beginning of our Lord's public ministry. The whole chapter can be seen as a strategic whole whereby our Lord is preparing us to receive by faith the gift of the Eucharist.

The first part of the strategy is a series of miracles to evoke the faith of the disciples: the multiplication of the loaves (Jn 6:1-15), and the walking on the water with the calming of the storm at sea (Jn 6:16-24). After these, the Jews ask for another sign to undergird the Lord's teaching that they must believe in Him (Jn 6:29). The Lord then illuminates for them the fact that the manna of the exodus from Egypt was merely a shadow of the true Bread from Heaven that He gives. This is called the "Bread of Life Discourse." In it, the Lord excites the desire of the Jews for the new manna; at first they say, "Lord give us this bread always." (Jn 6:34) As he teaches them that He is the One sent from the Father, Who, Himself, is the Bread from Heaven, they begin to murmur and doubt. Yet, despite their hardness of heart, the Lord persists in His teaching and finally makes the connection between the new Bread from Heaven and His own flesh, "...if anyone eats this bread, he will live forever; and the bread that I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh."

For the faithless, doubt turns into obstinance. They understand that the Lord is communicating His desire for them to consume the new Bread from Heaven which is His Flesh. Many of them say, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" (Jn 6:53) In response to their question, the Lord reaffirms his teaching repeatedly (Jn 6:53-58), saying, "...unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you." (Jn 6:53) The Greek text of this passage uses a word for "eat" that is unmistakable in its intended message, literally meaning to chew.

The Lord, in this Eucharistic context predicts Judas' betrayal (Jn 6:64), and some of the disciples abandon Him. (Jn 6:66) Even the apostles are challenged by this teaching, and our Lord knows it. He asks them if they too will depart. St. Peter speaks for us all when he says, in verse 68, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

To keep our love for the Eucharist strong and reap more copious graces from our reception of Holy Communion, we need to understand just what we are doing at the Mass. When we do, we will joyfully spend our live in praise to God! ~Fr. O'Brien
