SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Now that the season of Easter and the subsequent feast days are passed, we have entered into the *tempus per annum*. For the English Mass, these Sundays are named "Ordinary Time." For the Latin Mass, they are named, the "Sundays after Pentecost." With the new season comes a new liturgical color, as well as new music.

The music at a solemn Mass (such as our Sunday 9:15am Mass and 11am Mass) can be divided into three categories, whether English or Latin. These are the "propers," the "ordinary," and the discretionary. Discretionary music fills the timing of a liturgical action when a proper or ordinary does not cover the whole action. This would include preludes, postludes, and choral motets, among others. Propers include the entrance (introit), gradual/responsorial psalm, alleluia, offertory and communion chants. Each Mass of the calendar has a set of these chants. They are generally brief and have a great antiquity among Catholic music. The propers are so called because these texts with their chants are 'proper' to the Mass to which they belong, they are not often shared among the various Mass texts. Thus, the introit for Easter Sunday, for example, is not repeated at any other Mass of the year. The "ordinary" chants, however, are musical pieces that are repeated from Mass to Mass. There are 5 texts which comprise the ordinary: the Kyrie, the Gloria, the Credo, the Sanctus, and the Agnus Dei. Of course, these texts are repeated at every Mass. While the text is repeated, the musical setting varies.

One of the blessings of our heritage as Catholics is the centuries worth of musical compositions which are uniquely ours. Uniquely "Catholic" music (Gregorian Chant) has even been promoted explicitly by the magisterium of old, and of today (*Sacrosanctum concilium* 116, Pope Francis address to Italian Musicians, Sept. 28, 2019, etc.). This is the reason St. Patrick's puts so much emphasis on Gregorian Chant. It is the music the Church asks us to use since it is especially suited for the worship of God and does not aim to evoke the passions of the flesh!

Over the centuries, Gregorian Chant compositions proliferated. At one time, there were literally hundreds of chant pieces, both ancient and modern. To provide us with the best of the best, the Church's magisterium has assembled a volume called the *Kyriale* so that the "ordinary" chants of the Mass would be used with some consistency across the church, while still allowing for musical variety on different occasions. So, as the official music of the Mass, the Church has promoted 18 different settings of the "Ordinary" and noted on which celebrations these chants should be used. The Gloria which St. Patrick's parishioners will most easily recognize is Gloria VIII, also named, *De Angelis*. This beautiful chant is marked in the *Kyriale* as most fitting on feast days. We continue to observe this at St. Patrick's such as on our Solemn Weekday Masses in the evenings. There is some room for discretion when selecting among the ordinary chant settings, so in our music program, we will continue to use Mass VIII for the Sundays of Christmas, as well.

For the current liturgical season, the Church asks us to give preference to Mass XI. First of all, I sincerely want to encourage each person to sing the ordinary of the Mass. The ordinary chants are a special facet of the Mass where we, the Mystical Body, can join together in a unified voice of praise to God. Even though many of you are less familiar with the Gloria of Mass XI, I hope that you come to love hearing from the variety of the Church chants! The music notation is provided by the front doors. Gloria XI is easy to learn: the musical themes repeat themselves, and the range is smaller so to accommodate a variety of voices. If anyone is interested in some personal attention as you try to learn this current Gloria, please contact me!

As a wise mother, the Church trains us through her liturgical music to rise above individual taste and unite with our Catholic brothers and sisters through the ages as we chant God's praise.

FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

In this Year of the Eucharist, here are several ideas from the Maronite Monks of Adoration for making a holy adoration.

- Slowly read Sacred Scripture until something hits you. Then listen.
- Say the Holy Rosary.
- Pray as you can, not as you can't.
- Look at the Good God, and let Him look at you.
- Consider that the Sacred Body of Jesus came from Holy Mary. Thank her.
- Tell Jesus something that made you happy. Then listen.
