


INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC

On Sunday, 1 August at 4:00 p.m., we will sing Vespers of the Tenth Sunday after Pentecost. Please plan to attend; all are welcome!




SUNDAY COFFEE HOUR RETURNS

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The Holy Father's latest Motu Proprio regarding the Traditional Latin Mass has sent sock waves through the whole Catholic world. Essentially, the document reassigns the power to authorize the celebration of the 1962 Missal away from individual priests and places that power into the hands of the bishops. The motivation for this move is based on his desire to eliminate possible sources of disunity within the Church. After consulting the world's bishops in 2020, the Holy Father felt the need to strongly respond to disunity that some bishops reported.

Many of you have expressed your distress at this new development. Indeed, in that, I join you. First, allow me to reassure you that Archbishop Aymond is committed to continuing the pastoral care of our Latin Mass parishioners. To him we owe a debt of gratitude! This moment in the Church's history elicits a response from the faithful. Unfortunately, our first impulse may not be a virtuous one. However, calm can be restored by calling to mind that our Heavenly Father holds these events in the palm of His hand. There are graces and blessings to come from this moment, if we strive for the virtuous response.

We have to presume that the Holy Father is genuinely concerned for the welfare of the Church in making this decision. At the same time, we can disagree with him about this exercise of his prudential judgement. I believe that the disagreement is based on the fact that disunity is not necessarily tied to the observance of the Traditional Latin Mass. If the 1962 Missal has become associated with division, then it falls to us to correct that perception. Last Sunday, I requested that those attached to the Latin Mass would summarize their thoughts for me regarding the positive aspects of the Latin Mass. If we better communicate these, then we can turn the tide and change the reputation of division that is perceived by the Holy Father. Many of you have already responded to my request, for that I am grateful. I look forward to sharing excerpts through the bulletin.

I would like to offer my own contribution to this effort. Much can be said, but one element of the Traditional Latin Mass that has been transformative for me is the intentional presence of silence. At the beginning of the Mass, and during the Canon, the people observe the priest silently at prayer. So much in our daily experience is attached to a continuous stream of noise. Even pleasant noise does not have the same power to foster interiority and dialog with God that silence has. In fact, for this reason I not only enjoy celebrating the Latin Mass, but I also relish in opportunities to attend it as well. Since concelebration is not part of the Latin Mass, priests who attend join themselves to sacred action, not with their ears alone, but with their heart. Silence creates a decision point for us: will we be overcome by distraction, give in to boredom, or will we allow the silence to make room for what is heavenly? Silence that is filled with the prayers of the faithful is often a tangible element that evokes the sacred and stirs me to prayer.
