## SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

It brings me great pleasure to announce that Archbishop Aymond has assigned to St. Patrick's an additional permanent deacon. Deacon Kenny Uhlich will join our parish clergy starting in September. Deacon Kenny has been serving at Most Holy Trinity Parish in Covington since his ordination in 2015, but has been no stranger to St. Patrick's. In fact, he proposed to his wife, Christina, at St. Patrick's. He and his wife are raising their 4 children in Covington. Deacon Kenny looks forward to assisting at St. Patrick's liturgies, to preaching, to offering additional opportunities for adult catechetical formation and apostolate. Deacon Chris and I feel very blessed to be serving our parish with Deacon Kenny. **Please join us in welcoming him to our parish next week after the 9:15 a.m. Mass.**



Today, I would like to share with you another testimony of grace flowing from the Latin Mass. A fellow parishioner related to me in her letter that she was born and received her sacraments prior to the liturgical reforms. When raising her own family, she followed the *Novus Ordo* faithfully and fruitfully. Then, on one particular occasion, a Saints game gave them motivation to attend Mass at St. Patrick's; it was during the pastorate of Msgr. Reynolds. She writes, "To our surprise, we found ourselves at a Latin Mass. We were both overwhelmed by the beauty and majesty of the church, and by the sacred liturgy filled with incense...and Gregorian chant." After that experience, she felt draw to attend St. Patrick's more frequently. She continues, "We felt as [though] we had returned home. Family and friends thought we had lost our minds, and that it was silly to drive fifty minutes to attend Mass. We were often accused of wanting to live in the past! But we were so grateful to have re-discovered the Latin Mass."

She noted that the Latin Mass helps her and her husband to share their faith, "I believe that this form of the Mass invites such intense participation and intimacy and community, that we always invite friends and family to join us and see what we love about the liturgy." She shares how the Latin language, the ancient music, and the atmosphere of prayer reminds her that the Mass is different from any other gathering on earth. She writes, "I think community is rooted in this prayer and overflows to personal fellowship before and after Mass."

This testimony of God's grace helps us to see the many ways that the Mass serves to unify. First, the Mass allows us unity with God—this must be prior to all other considerations. But also, we join the wider Body of Christ in the Mass, those we see weekly in our church, those we bring with us, those who have worshiped before our time, and the Church militant of our own day spread throughout the world. The holy liturgy truly creates a home for us where we can unite with God as our Father, and with the whole family He draws to Himself! ~Fr. O'Brien

## FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

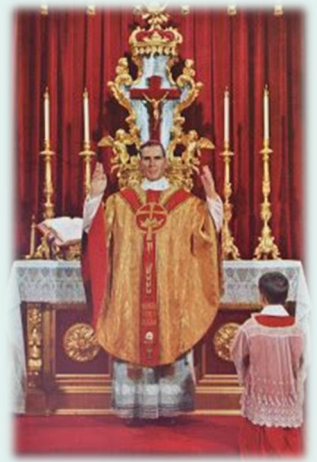
