

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

At the start of this current "Year of the Eucharist," I began a bulletin series on the scriptural foundations of our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. After a few months on other topics, I'd like to take up that subject again, but from another angle, that of the Church Fathers.

Our faith is rooted in the teachings of Christ and God's revelation protected by Scripture, Tradition and the Magisterium. These three foundations of revealed truth remind us that our faith is not limited to the strict words on the page of Holy Scripture. But Sacred Scripture, while never to be contradicted, can be expounded and better understood through the ages—a process called development of doctrine. By taking the time to study the exercise of the teaching authority in the early Church, we better understand the ways that the Holy Spirit preserved the deposit of faith, while fostering genuine development by the virtuous use of human intellect. In this light, we can find in the early Church Fathers a reliable guide to the way Sacred Scripture and the oral teachings of the Apostles were understood and taught by their immediate successors.

To begin, I'll point your attention to the Didache (DID-ah-kay) from about the year 90AD. It is a collection of very early teachings, some of which pertain to the Eucharist. The first citation discusses the one receiving this great gift. "But let no one eat or drink of your Thanksgiving [Eucharist], but they who have been baptized into the name of the Lord; for concerning this also the Lord has said, Give not that which is holy to the dogs." Already, it is obvious that Holy Communion is no ordinary food. It is only fitting for the followers of Christ.

Secondly, this meal-set-apart is intrinsically connected to the presence of God. "But after you are filled [with the Eucharist], thus give thanks: We thank You, holy Father, for Your holy name which You caused to tabernacle in our hearts, and for the knowledge and faith and immortality, which You made known to us through Jesus Your Servant[...]" This recommended prayer after receiving Holy Communion uses the interesting phrase, "tabernacle in our hearts" to describe what God is doing for us by the Eucharist. Jews of the first century would have understood this phrase very well. It was often used as a way to describe God's unique presence within the Jewish temple. However, now in the Christian context, the early Church understood the presence of God to now be extended into the very core of those who partake in the Holy Eucharist. ~Fr. O'Brien
