FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

The Rosary, precisely because it starts with Mary's own experience, is *an exquisitely contemplative prayer*. Without this contemplative dimension, it would lose its meaning, as Pope Paul VI clearly pointed out: "Without contemplation, the Rosary is a body without a soul, and its recitation runs the risk of becoming a mechanical repetition of formulas, in violation of the admonition of Christ: 'In praying do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think they will be heard for their many words' (Mt 6:7). By its nature the recitation of the Rosary calls for a quiet rhythm and a lingering pace, helping the individual to meditate on the mysteries of the Lord's life as seen through the eyes of her who was closest to the Lord. In this way the unfathomable riches of these mysteries are disclosed"



In St. John Paul II's *Rosarium Virginis Mariae*, he wonderfully conveys how the rosary is designed, and truly conceived, for contemplation. Contemplation can take varied forms – especially if you're praying with children! Below are some gentle probes to aid little ones in developing their contemplative 'muscles.'

"What do you think Jesus looked like as a child?"

"Imagine Mother Mary being crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth!"

"Try to picture the Holy Spirit descending!"

"Feel the heavy wood of the cross Christ carried for you"

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The teaching of our Lord about the Eucharist was undergirded by the signs and prophecies of the Old Testament. These served to prepare God's people. Even while on Earth, our Lord gradually made known to His disciples the mysteries of the Blessed Sacrament through signs, miracles, and his words in John 6 and at the Last Supper. Ever since our Lord's Eucharistic teachings, the faithful have been pondering this doctrine with attention and care. In my current bulletin series, I'm examining the ways that the early Church reflected upon the Sacrament of the Altar and unpacked that mystery with reverence as well as intellectual skill. Last week, we saw that even before the end of the first century, the Blessed Sacrament was associated with thanksgiving, thus earning for Itself the name, Eucharist. It was also something set apart, only for the faithful, and has a particular connection to the presence of God. These ideas only become clearer as we look at the texts from the second century.

St. Ignatius of Antioch (c. 110 AD) writes to the Romans, "I have no taste for corruptible food nor for the pleasures of this life. I desire the Bread of God, which is the flesh of Jesus Christ..." From this, we can tell that the early Christians received Christ's teaching at the Last Supper as a literal teaching: the bread becomes the Body of Christ. He also writes to the Philadelphians, "Take care, then, to use one Eucharist, so that whatever you do, you do according to God: for there is one flesh of our Lord Jesus Christ..." From this text, we can see that the term 'Eucharist' has become common. Also, Ignatius is contributing to our notion of the true communion among believers brought about because of this great gift.

St. Justin, martyr, writes just a few decades after St. Ignatius. In his *First Apology*, he teaches about the need for faith and holiness of life prior to approaching the Sacrament, "We call this food Eucharist; and no one else is permitted to partake of it, except one who believes our teaching to be true and who has been washed in the washing which is for the remission of sins and for regeneration [Baptism], and is thereby living as Christ has enjoined." After expounding upon who may receive It, he illuminates what this Sacrament is, "For not as common bread nor common drink do we receive these; but since Jesus Christ our Savior was made incarnate by the word of God and had both flesh and blood for our salvation, so too, as we have been taught, the food which has been made into the Eucharist by the Eucharistic prayer set down by Him, and by the change of which our blood and flesh is nourished, is both the flesh and the blood of that incarnate Jesus." Here we see several ideas clarified: first, the Eucharist is not a common meal, yet It is for our nourishment. Second, the incarnation of Christ in the womb of the Virgin is likened to His coming in the Flesh through the Eucharistic mystery. Third, there is a sacramental change that takes place when the Eucharistic prayer is prayed and this prayer is given to us by Christ. One final quote from St. Justin sheds light on the reality that the Eucharist is a sacrificial prayer. He evokes the Old Testament Malachi as he writes in his *Dialogue with Trypho*, "Moreover, as I said before, concerning the sacrifices which you at that time offered, God speaks through Malachi [1:10-12]...It is of the sacrifices offered to Him in every place by us, the Gentiles, that is, of the bread of the Eucharist and likewise of the cup of the Eucharist, that He speaks at that time; and He says that we glorify His name, while you profane it."

As we can see, it did not take long for the heavenly gift of the Eucharist to captivate the theological attention of the early Church. But these notions did not stay locked up in speculative writings. Even though these teachings were among the most mysterious from our Savior, the Fathers of the Church were insistent that they be made known to all the faithful. In the Eucharist, we have access to the real presence of Christ, therefore increasing our love for the Blessed Sacrament and proclaiming this grace to others is just as vital for us in our day! ~Fr. 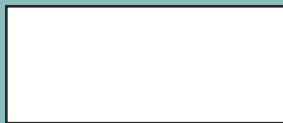
