SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Each year, Catholic organizations across our archdiocese rally their supporters for a common effort in fundraising. The yearly iGiveCatholic campaign is a regional event that very concretely assists our local parish. You can participate through the parish website, or you can also support our campaign by giving cash or check through the collection—just mark the donation iGiveCatholic.

The funds this year will serve to promote our various parish ministries. If I'm honest, so much of my effort since arriving at St. Patrick's has been focused on building and administrative needs. With this campaign, I would like to take a new step in service to our parishioners and our neighborhood. Our parish is abundantly blessed by the beauty of our churches and the richness of our liturgy. With additional resources available to our apostolates, we can take a concrete step to share the richness of our worship and act on it in service to others. The works of the apostolate are essential to our mission—the Lord himself left us with the words, "Go into the whole world to proclaim the Gospel!" This preaching cannot be limited to what our clergy does in the pulpit on Sundays. Instead, I envision our parish offering a comprehensive set of opportunities for any parishioner, young or old, to learn their faith and act on it. Such a vision will take some time to unfold, but this fundraising campaign will firm up the foundation already laid.

Our parish children and teens have the opportunity to grow in their faith by sacramental catechesis. This campaign will help fund materials needed in that effort, as well as the parish celebrations which follow their Sacraments of Initiation. Our young people also act on their faith through the children's choirs and the Junior Servers' Guild. This campaign will allow us to promote these initiatives and encourage fellowship among families. Many families take advantage of our Sunday morning coffee hour after the 9:15 a.m. and 11 a.m. Masses. We can make sure to provide well for these gatherings so as to foster the family atmosphere of our parish. We have hosted several catechetical events for our young adults with great success. This campaign will allow us to provide for speakers and refreshments to draw in the crowd. Adults have had opportunities to grow in faith by book studies and other presentations. Raising funds will increase opportunities in this area as well. Our parish men's club, the St. Joseph's Guild, has been planning to initiate an outreach to the needy. As they gather ideas and manpower, the funds can assist in their efforts as well.

The realities of recent times have been felt quite concretely by our parish. Simply looking at the attendance at parish Masses, one can easily see that the pandemic has taken a toll. In addition, some parishioners have still not returned since the trauma of Hurricane Ida. In order to kindle again the practice of the faith, our parish needs to take a new step to draw back those who may have strayed due to life's challenges. St. Patrick's has a very unique community life. On one hand, St. Patrick's is the only functioning church (Catholic or Protestant) in our whole original territorial foot print. Therefore, promoting these apostolates will help to make our presence known to the residents moving into our neighborhood. At the same time, most of the faithful of our parish come from other parish territories. In fact, according to our parish history book, this phenomenon has been the reality since 1920! It's a reality to be embraced and fostered. I truly believe that enhancing our apostolate offerings will serve this purpose. Our parishioners will know that St. Patrick's and St. John are their home, not just on Sundays, but for all their spiritual needs!

I pray that you'll take some time to consider a gift to this year's iGiveCatholic campaign. You contribution will be a blessing to those seeking to learn and act on their faith!
