FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

"The kingdom belongs to the poor and the lowly, which means those who have accepted it with humble hearts. Jesus is sent to 'preach good news to the poor;' He declares them blessed, for 'theirs is the kingdom of heaven.' To them, - the 'little ones'- the Father is pleased to reveal what remains hidden from the wise and the learned. Jesus shares the life of the poor, from the cradle to the cross; he experiences hunger, thirst, and privation. Jesus identifies himself with the poor of every kind and makes active love toward them the condition for entering his kingdom." (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

This month, I'd like to continue to expand on the idea of poverty and how we, as the laity, can stretch outside of ourselves to minister to the less fortunate. The above excerpt from the Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks directly to the poverty of Christ and how fundamental it was to His mission. SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

First, a word of congratulations to Mr. Mills on a very fine Evening of Organ Music this past Wednesday. I know I join with so many parishioners in thanking God that we benefit from the musical talents of our organist and choirmaster! We all look forward to enjoying the fruit of our musicians' labors for the Solemn Mass of Christmas at midnight. On that occasion, our liturgy will be accompanied by the Haydn *Missa Brevis in B-flat major*.

Please remember everyone is invited to our Sunday morning coffee hour. After the morning Masses each Sunday, please stop by the courtyard for some fellowship. We just completed a brick stoop for the statue of Mary which has long watched over our courtyard. Thanks to our men's club, The St. Joseph's Guild, for their assistance with this project! Thanks also to our volunteer gardeners who help keep the courtyard so beautiful!



As we continue this Year of the Eucharist, allow me to highlight those theologians which followed the Council of Nicaea during the fourth century. St. Ephraim, the Syrian (d. 373) writes of what it might have been like to hear the words of Christ at the Last Supper. He expands upon Christ's words saying, "Take, all of you eat of this, which My word has made holy. Do not now regard as bread that which I have given you; but take, eat this Bread [of life], and do not scatter the crumbs; for what I have called My Body, that it is indeed. One particle from its crumbs is able to sanctify thousands and thousands, and is sufficient to afford life to those who eat of it. Take, eat, entertaining no doubt of faith, because this is My Body, and whoever eats it in belief eats in it Fire and Spirit." This pious reflection on what Christ may have said to His disciples expresses that the early Church was comfortable with theological development joined always to a solid foundation in Apostolic teaching.

The great defender of the Faith, St. Athanasius (d. 373), explained Christian worship to a catechumen saying, "[A]fter the great prayers and holy supplications have been sent forth, the Word comes down into the bread and wine -- and thus is His Body conformed." Thus, he continues the unbroken tradition of understanding Christ's words at the Last Supper literally.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem (d. 386) also instructs his disciples many times to take literally the words of Christ at the Last Supper. Addressing a doubter he writes, "Once in Cana of Galilee He changed the water into wine, a thing related to blood; and is His changing of wine into Blood not credible?" Again he writes, "Do not, therefore, regard the Bread and the Wine as simply that; for they are, according to the Master's declaration, the Body and Blood of Christ. Even though the senses suggest to you the other, let faith make you firm." It is important to note that St. Cyril also speaks frequently of the sacrificial nature of the Eucharist, and the importance of offering the sacrifice of the Mass for the dead. ~Fr. O'Brien
