VI. LOVE FOR THE POOR

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Continuing our examination of the writings of early Church Fathers on the Eucharist, we can see how quickly our understanding of the Eucharist grew. Seeing the continuous, unbroken lineage between their beliefs and ours helps us to be certain that we have correctly understood the teaching which Christ Himself gave to the Apostles. Last time, I presented the writings of Sts. Justin, martyr and Ignatius of Antioch. Today, I'll bring us to the Council of Nicea in the fourth century.

St. Irenaeus of Lyon, (d. 202 A.D.) wrote referencing the prophecy of continuous sacrifice contained in the Old Testament book of Malachi, "He taught the new sacrifice of the new covenant, of which Malachi, one of the twelve prophets, had signified beforehand: [quotes Mal 1:10-11]. By these words He makes it plain that the former people will cease to make offerings to God; but that in every place sacrifice will be offered to Him, and indeed, a pure one; for His name is glorified among the Gentiles." The fact is here reaffirmed that offering the Holy Mass is, indeed, a representation of Christ's sacrificial love. St. Irenaeus also teaches about the effect that consuming the Eucharist has on us. He says, "[our] flesh which is nourished by the body and blood of the Lord...receiving the Word of God, becomes the Eucharist, which is the Body and Blood of Christ..." Therefore, the grace that we receive by the Eucharist has the power to change us to be another Christ for our world today. The implication for our mission and our community life in the world are many!

Tertullian (d. 250) speaks of the reverence due to the Eucharist, "We take anxious care lest something of our Cup or Bread should fall upon the ground..." In addition, he shows that because the Eucharist is a sacrifice, It has the power to obtain graces. He writes, "A woman, after the death of her husband, ... prays for his soul and asks that he may, while waiting, find rest; and that he may share in the first resurrection. And each year, on the anniversary of his death, she offers the sacrifice." This is evidence for our practice of offering Masses for certain intentions.

Origen (d. 254) also writes about the reverence due to the Eucharist, but draws the connection between Eucharistic piety and devotion to the scriptural Word of God. He writes, "You are accustomed to take part in the divine mysteries, so you know how, when you have received the Body of the Lord, you reverently exercise every care lest a particle of it fall, and lest anything of the consecrated gift perish....how is it that you think neglecting the word of God a lesser crime than neglecting His Body?"

St. Cyprian of Carthage (d. 258) gives early expression to the power of the priest to act *in persona Christi capitis*. Since the teaching is clear that the Eucharist is the Body of the Lord offered in sacrifice to the Father, then as the priest offers that sacrifice, he does what Christ does: he acts in the person of Christ the head of the body. St. Cyprian writes, "If Christ Jesus, our Lord and God, is Himself the High Priest of God the Father; and if he offered Himself as a sacrifice to the Father; and if He commanded that this be done in commemoration of Himself -- then certainly the priest, who imitates that which Christ did, truly functions in place of Christ." Notice that the message St. Cyprian is communicating is by no means a symbolic act, or a reenactment. Indeed, the consistent teaching of the Christ is that the priest, by the power of the sacrament, is doing on the altar what Christ did upon the cross.

Finally, the Council of Nicea in the year 325 is recognized as the first ecumenical council of the 21. It had the task of clarifying doctrine regarding the nature of Christ's humanity and divinity. But, it also commented on liturgical practices. This brief comment makes clear that the main Eucharistic teachings (like the ones from the church fathers above) were already beyond dispute. What had to be clarified were merely procedural matters regarding who ministers the Sacrament to whom. Canon 8 asserts, "the canon nor the custom permits those who do not offer sacrifice to give the Body of Christ to those who do offer the sacrifice."

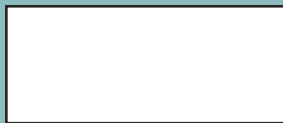
