SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

To all those who participated in this year's iGiveCatholic Campaign, please know of my heartfelt gratitude! Please take some time to read my letter regarding St. Patrick's Advent Appeal and St. John the Baptist's Annual Appeal. These efforts are vital for fully funding our budget and advancing God's Kingdom here in downtown New Orleans!

To continue my reflections on the early Church Fathers and their Eucharistic doctrine, I present to you today three Eastern Fathers of the fourth century. St. Basil the Great (d. 379), St. Gregory of Nazianzus (d. 389), and St. Gregory of Nyssa (d. 394) all spread the Gospel in Asia Minor, modern-day Turkey. St. Basil's writings indicate that the real change from bread and wine to Body and Blood is well-established doctrine. What he writes illuminates the already-existing liturgical life of the Church: Holy Communion is celebrated frequently and there is a calendar of saints to adorn the year. Here are his words written to a faithful laywoman, "To communicate each day and to partake of the holy Body and Blood of Christ is good and beneficial; for He says quite plainly: 'He that eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life.' Who can doubt that to share continually in life is the same thing as having life abundantly? We ourselves communicate four times each week...and on other days if there is a commemoration of any saint."

St. Gregory of Nazianzus extols the glories of the Eucharistic sacrifice which he calls a greater thing than raising the dead. He then writes, "Do, then, the greater thing by celebrating the liturgy, and loose the great mass of my sins when you lay hold of the Sacrifice of the Resurrection. Most Reverend friend, cease not to pray and plead for me when you draw down the Word by your word, when in an unbloody cutting you cut the Body and Blood of the Lord, using your voice for a sword." Here, we notice St. Gregory emphasizing the sacrificial nature of the Mass. He says that this sacrifice is so powerful that it forgives sins. By this he equates the sacrifice of our Lord on Calvary with the sacrifice of our Lord, through the priest, upon the altar! He also contributes an important concept to theology when he calls the sacrifice of the altar and "unbloody" sacrifice. Such a notice is vital for a full understanding of the properly, "sacramental" nature of the Eucharist: a sign which effects grace.

St. Gregory of Nyssa sees in the Eucharist a kind of fulfillment of the Jewish temple sacrifices of old. In Jewish temple worship, the sacrifice of the lamb was completed when it was slaughtered then eaten. In a similar way, the celebration of the Eucharist allows us not only to be in the presence of Christ's Body and Blood, allows us not only to witness the sacrificial offering of the Body and Blood to the Father (by the words of the priest), but also allows us to complete that sacrifice by our individual participation by consuming the Lamb of God. Another important contribution of St. Gregory came from his thoughts regarding the nature of the transformation that takes place at the consecration of the Mass. First, he makes clear that the bread is transformed by Christ's word (and subsequently by the priest's word) from bread and wine to Body and Blood. He utilizes philosophical concepts to advance our understanding. This transformation, he says, affects the substance of bread, while still retaining something of its likeness to bread. His insights seem to be setting the stage for the later application of 'substance' and 'accident' to the Eucharistic species. He goes on to reflect how this transformation of bread and wine to Body and Blood is parallel to when God took on flesh in the Virgin's womb. Likewise, there is a transformation to take place as believers consume the divine presence at Communion. In the Eucharist, we are transformed! He writes, "In the plan of His grace He spreads Himself to every believer by means of that Flesh, [...] blending Himself with the bodies of believers, so that by this union with the Immortal, man, too, may become a participant in incorruption." ~Fr. O'Brien
