You may have heard about the next synod being called by Pope Francis. Our Holy Father wants to more deeply examine the role of synodality in the Church. His plan for achieving this is to solicit the views and convictions of Catholics from around the world. Each diocese is asked to collect feedback from the faithful which will be presented to the synod leadership next year. Our Archdiocese is proceeding with various meetings to listen to the faithful. In addition to these meetings, all are welcome to submit their thoughts via our Archdiocese of New Orleans synod website: nolacatholic.com/ synod2021. Please visit this website for information about the meetings. Also, please notice that there is a place to submit your thoughts along the left side of that site. I sincerely encourage you to respectfully and thoughtfully make your voice heard during this unique world-wide consultation. For those of you who wrote letters to the Archbishop expressing your gratitude for the Latin Mass, please submit your letter in this forum as well. Please be sure to include your name and home parish so the comments can be verified and properly accounted for. I might suggest for you to offer your views on what challenges face the Church today, things like communicating the faith to our young people, evangelizing individuals and our wider culture. Other helpful views pertain to catechesis, liturgy, seminary formation, social outreach, religious freedom, political interaction, etc. May the Holy Spirit guide this process for the well being of our mother the Church!

Today, I would like to present to you selections from St. Augustine (d. 430). He will be the final Church Father in my current bulletin series. St. Augustine is well respected by many non-Catholic Christian denominations and for that reason, it is especially helpful to be familiar with his doctrine. As you can see below, St. Augustine builds upon the clarity of the Scriptures and the Fathers before him. First, notice his certainty about Christ's intention to teach that the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ; the mystery is not merely symbolic. He once preached, "What you see is the bread and the chalice; that is what your own eyes report to you. But what your faith obliges you to accept is that the bread is the Body of Christ and the chalice the Blood of Christ." This teaching occurs several times in Augustine's corpus. He does not leave room for confusion, the bread and wine are changed into Christ's Body and Blood.

Not only is the consecrated Bread and Wine now the real presence of Christ, but they are present as a sacrifice. In the Holy Mass, what Christ did once upon the Cross is renewed and re-presented. He teaches, "Was not Christ immolated only once in His very Person? In the Sacrament, nevertheless, He is immolated for the people not only on every Easter Solemnity but on every day; and a man would not be lying if, when asked, he were to reply that Christ is being immolated." Since the earliest times of the Church, the Eucharist has been understood as both the presence of Christ, and the sacramental reality of His saving act of self-sacrifice.


St. Augustine takes this teaching on the sacrificial value of the Eucharist and applies it to us. He says, the self-offering of Christ, the head, must be imitated by the faithful, the body. "Christ is both the Priest, offering Himself, and Himself the Victim. He willed that the sacramental sign of this should be the daily Sacrifice of the Church, who, since the Church is His body and He the Head, learns to offer herself through Him." The Eucharist is both the presence of Christ as well as His sacrifice; the Eucharist is offered by Christ, through the priest so that all the faithful may each join themselves to Him as a pleasing offering to the Father. Inspired by these teachings, let us view our daily duties and burdens through a Eucharistic lens. What our Savior did once upon the cross, is now available to us; joined to the Eucharist our every sacrifice is lifted to the Father! ~Fr. O'Brien
