FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

I recall on Ash Wednesday of 2019 when I was in Adoration feeling the weight of my studies and my relationships most deeply. It was in the Mass that followed at Christ the King at LSU that the Lord gave me new insight into what solemn joy really means. It seems to be a contradictory term at first to have a joy that is solemn or somehow serious. It is in those moments of strife and pain that we are reminded of the many graces that the Lord so lovingly gives. There is joy in our suffering because in it we find our Father who is never absent when we need Him. Solemn joy is the treasure of Lent because the rejoicing of Easter lives even in the pain and restitutions of the Lenten season. If the cross prevails in the end, then even in the thick of all our own pains, confusions, anger, and faults, we have Christ as our guide, and his way always leads to loving communion, a joy most solemn, a joy most true where all comes to an end in final love.



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

As Holy Week approaches, let us be very intentional about how we spend the remainder of Lent. The liturgy and the décor of the church all communicate that a time of more severe focus is upon us. With our eyes upon the Lord, we can align our souls with the events of Christ's passion and reap the abundant fruits of His self-sacrifice. This will yield greater virtue for us, deepened charity for our Lord and others, as well as more strength as we endure our own crosses.

Continuing my comments on the liturgies of Holy Week, let us turn now to Good Friday. From the earliest times of the Church, there was no Mass celebrated on Good Friday. Perhaps this reflects a kind of shock at what we feel on this sacred day. We are stunned to such a degree that even our most basic routine is interrupted. Of course, the Mass is the sacramental re-presentation of Calvary. Perhaps in abstaining from the celebration of Mass is a means by which we set aside the sacramental event and focus more intently upon the historical event of the Passion. Or perhaps, the remembrance of our shameful role in the Lord's passion causes us to shrink back from the blessing of partaking in the celebration of Mass. Yet, in His perfect mercy, we are still granted access to the Eucharist on this day. This is just a start to the profound reflections possible on this sacred day!

The liturgy itself has three main components. First the chanting of the Passion joined to the intercessions, then the veneration of the Cross, then the distribution of Holy Communion. The liturgy begins with a very dramatic statement of humility before God. The sacred ministers all lie prostrate on the altar steps. This gesture is very rare in the Roman Rite, appearing at religious professions, ordinations and on Good Friday. It shows an admission of our own inadequacy before God, complete surrender to Him, and serves as a plea for His divine assistance. After rising, the priest prays the opening prayer, which both gives voice to our deep need for deliverance from sin, as well as our hope that Christ has conquered death and now stands ready to offer us grace. The first part of the liturgy continues as three clerics ceremoniously chant the Passion from St. John's Gospel divided into parts. In His Passion, we see Christ making intercession for the whole world by His self sacrifice. Therefore, we too join our prayers to His as we offer the Great Intercessions.

Next, we slowly lift our gaze to the cross. By means of a ritual, the priest gradually introduces the cross to the people as we chant our adoration and bend the knee. The whole congregation advances and venerates the cross with a kiss or with a genuflection. During the veneration, the choir sings the reproaches, a rare occasion when the liturgy calls for Greek, "Agios O Theos..." These prayers movingly express the depth of human suffering and repentance before God. The whole experience demonstrates God's willingness to condescend into the worst of our condition so as to lovingly raise us up.

After we adore the cross, we are then prepared to meet the One who, so long ago, gave His life for us. The Eucharist is brought into the church, we pray the Lord's Prayer and consume the precious fruit from the tree of the cross. In this Holy Communion, we declare that we too invite the redeeming power of Christ's cross into our sufferings. ~Fr. O'Brien


