FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

As we journey through Lent, we will be sharing parishioner testimonies of their experience in a personal desert and how the Light of Christ conquered.

On April 8, 2020 my husband of 49 years died of cancer, two days before Good Friday and just a few days after the Covid 19 lockdown. That year, my Lent didn't end at Easter. My time in the desert of grief, separated from loved ones, unable to attend Mass, receive the Eucharist, cut off from all sources of comfort, was truly the most painful time of my life. I prayed almost constantly that God would lead me to a place where I could once again practice my precious Catholic Faith and begin to heal. God answered that prayer by making it possible for me to become a parishioner of St. Patrick's. It was there that I received my "first communion" in many months and immediately felt the power of that miracle at work within my soul. Now whenever the desert of sorrow, loneliness, anxiety or doubt threatens, you will find me in that beautiful oasis on Camp Street, where God in His goodness, led me out of the darkness and into His light.

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

As Lent proceeds, take courage and stir your heart to joy in anticipation of the ways our Lent will make the graces of Easter come alive. We prepare for Easter by the penances and devotions of Lent, but let us also prepare by looking deeply into the liturgy as well. The liturgy is first of all an act of worship to God. As an act of worship, the more it expresses the truth of our faith, the greater act of worship it is. Therefore, we should invest our effort so to comprehend the liturgy as the Church gives it to us. This will help us conform our interior prayer to the prayer of the Church, allowing us to render to the Father that perfect worship in Spirit and Truth which is His due.

Over the next few weeks, allow me to reflect upon the liturgies which conclude Lent. First, consider Passion Sunday, the Sunday prior to Palm Sunday. At this time, the Church takes on a new character of mourning. Notice the texts of the prayers speak to our sorrow for the sufferings of our Savior. But notice, as well, that this sorrow is not all-consuming. At every liturgy of Holy Week, there are signs of the golden thread of hope which serves already as a flicker of Easter. I encourage you to pray with the chants and orations of the liturgies simultaneously with these two outlooks: we mourn the One who suffered, and we know His suffering love leads to perfect hope.

Externally, this reality is expressed in the liturgy by the veiling of the images in Church on Passion Sunday. These can be seen as the garments of a widow, but rather than black, these violet veils are a garment allowing for a hue of hope. These veils also serve as one additional layer of self-denial. We fast from beauty of images, even the image of the cross, so that the eyes of faith can become more focused upon His suffering. We also notice that on Passion Sunday, more signs of joy are stripped away such as the *Gloria Patri*..., and the prayers at the foot of the altar. However, to highlight the hope we anticipate, our Epistle speaks of the good things yet to come.

The Palm Sunday liturgy recounts the height of Christ's earthly glory (prior to the Resurrection) with the entrance into Jerusalem. What we hear in the Gospel, we ourselves imitate. We take up palms to join in His praises like the crowd of old. By processing with palms, we remind ourselves that our faith is meant to spread and to be made known publicly. At the same time, the procession tells us that following Christ means standing by His side, spending time with Him going where He goes. These signs of honor all too quickly fade as the liturgy then turns to the events of Christ's suffering and death.
