



FAMILY FUNDAMENTALS

Persevere This Lent

Before I was confirmed into the Church last May, I had a critical spiritual journey that continues to this day. I moved back from Alexandria, LA to a new house in Gretna, LA having failed at my prestigious job with the Attorney General's Office. I just came out

of a relationship; I had a falling out with a close friend. These downfalls were in part my doing as well. With all the walls removed from me, God began moving into my life. Through depression and despair, the faith of a mustard seed was planted. I began reconnecting with my Catholic faith - went to confession for the first time in decades. I began taking the Eucharist again and attending Church regularly. New direction



was paved in my life. The road was full of obstacles, but worth it. One thing that separates Catholicism from other traditions is the embrace of suffering. Jesus fasted 40 days in the desert warding off every temptation of Satan. He rejected Himself for our sake. As the mystery of suffering encompasses our lives and loved ones, let us remain steadfast in almsgiving, fasting & prayer.

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The liturgical riches of this Lenten season are many! Last week I shared some comments in preparation of Passiontide and Palm Sunday. Today is especially notable in its own right. Laetare Sunday gets its name from the first word of the introit chant meaning rejoice. This day is set aside to especially focus on joy during a penitential season. I like to call this the "both/ and" aspect of our life in Christ-it helps to highlight a great mystery. We spend this time in both penance and joy. There is no need to see a definitive divide between these two modes of life. We both walk with Christ in His suffering and we rejoice each day in His victory over death. We both mourn our sins with just penance, and we celebrate the fact that His work of love on the cross has removed our offence and restored our soul. We observe this day of joy by permitting flowers on the altar, as well as organ music at Mass. The vestments are rose colored and, at St. Patrick's, we solemnly sing vespers. Please join us Laetare Sunday at 4 p.m. for Vespers and benediction.

To fast forward a bit, I'd like to return now to Holy Week in reflection. Once our Palm Sunday procession has been completed, we are immersed in the passion of Christ by the Gospel. Then, in the traditional lectionary, the Passion accounts of Mark and Luke are read in the weekdays of Holy Week. The days leading up to the Sacred Triduum allow us to spend a week with Christ as if in real time. This helps us to align our hearts with the events, the emotions and the spiritual meaning of the passion. In His passion, Christ makes His most powerful display of compassion for us-He is with us even to the extent of taking on our own sufferings.

The Sacred Triduum begins with Holy Thursday. On this night, our Lord assembles His disciples to celebrate the Passover feast. There are so many layers of meaning to this meal to inspire our meditation. Consider the ways that our Lord shows Himself to be an observant Jew in celebrating the Passover. But at the same time, His words and actions signify that He not only observes, but fulfills this sacred meal, making Himself to be the new Paschal Lamb for the salvation of the world. He imparts to His apostles the gift of the Eucharist as well as the command to, "Do this in memory of me." These events, along the with the washing of the feet are traditionally associated with the conferral of Christ's ministerial priesthood upon the apostles.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper brings all of these mysteries together. It begins with joy, even allowing for bells and organ music at the start. Then the mood changes dramatically once the Gloria ends. Gradually, the liturgy of Holy Thursday trains our focus on our Lord's betrayal and arrest as we process to the altar of repose with the Most Blessed Sacrament, being both somber and grateful. After Mass, the Psalms are prayed without fanfare as the priest divests the altars and washes them. These ceremonies are a sacramental visualization that Christ, who divested Himself of heavenly glory, now allows Himself to be humiliated and stripped by men. To counterbalance this supreme injustice, we echo the psalmist's words of repentance while offering the little consolation of rosewater—a small act of love meant to express our worship and thanksgiving. The faithful are encouraged to continue adoring the Blessed Sacrament into the night. ~Fr. O'Brien
