Please plan to join us for this ancient and beautiful service of evening prayer. All are welcome!





Catholic Author Timothy Gordon



Please join us **April 3rd, 2022 at 12:00 p.m.** in the rectory.

The St. Joseph's Guild will be hosting the popular YouTube podcaster and author Mr. Timothy Gordon, he will be giving a presentation on his latest book: "The Case for Patriarchy".

He has studied philosophy in Pontifical graduate universities in Europe, taught at Southern Californian community colleges, holds degrees in literature, history, philosophy, and law.

Currently, he resides in central Mississippi, with his wife and six children. He recently left southern California, choosing to raise his

children in a state that is more in line with his Christian beliefs.

For 2000 years, Christianity has taught, with startling specificity, that married men are patriarchs who should relate to their wives as Christ relates to His Bride, the Church. As waves of feminism swept across the west in recent decades, our understanding of patriarchy became corrupted, and then labeled as toxic. In this book, Mr. Gordon pushes back on the narrative that patriarchy is dangerous to women and society, and explores the patriarchal virtues that all men should exercise in their homes and society, and what the restoration of a Christian patriarchy will look like, where justice and the common good will triumph.

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

As I conclude my remarks on the writings of St. Augustine, I would like to point out two final aspects of his Eucharistic doctrine. First, notice how Augustine comprehends the communal effect of the Eucharist. Since the Blessed Sacrament draws together the whole Body of Christ in all its members, so too must we remember the dead when we celebrate Holy Mass. The Eucharist creates a most-significant bond between all believes in Christ. Therefore, our prayers for the dead are most appropriate in the Mass.

He teaches, "But by the prayers of the Holy Church, and by the salvific sacrifice, and by the alms which are given for their spirits, there is no doubt that the dead are aided, that the Lord might deal more mercifully with them than their sins would deserve. For the whole Church observes this practice which was handed down by the fathers, that it prays for those who have died in the communion of the Body and Blood of Christ, when they are commemorated in their own place in the Sacrifice itself; and the Sacrifice is offered also in memory of them, on their behalf. [...] It is not at all to be doubted that such prayers are of profit to the dead; but for such of them as lived before their death in a way that makes it possible for these things to be useful to them after death."

Secondly, St. Augustine helps us to keep first things first in our Eucharistic devotion. The Eucharist bring about copious graces for the faithful, this has been obvious since the earliest times. The Eucharist is a meeting with Christ, It is the real presence of Christ, It is the re-presentation of the act which accomplished our salvation, It unites all the faithful in a divine bond of communion, but prior to all these, our first reaction to the Eucharist must be to worship. St. Augustine teaches, "...I turn to Christ, because it is He whom I seek here; and I discover how the earth is adored without impiety, how without impiety the footstool of His feet is adored. For He received earth from earth; because flesh is from the earth, and He took flesh from the flesh of Mary. He walked here in the same flesh, and gave us the same flesh to be eaten unto salvation. But no one eats that Flesh unless he first adores It; and thus it is discovered how such a footstool of the Lord's feet is adored; and not only do we not sin by adoring, we do sin by not adoring." The Eucharist is truly worthy of all the adoration we can muster by a lifetime of prayer and devotion. May our worship of the Eucharist become aflame with love and, by careful study, rich in understanding! ~Fr. O'Brien

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

In addition, **Fridays during Lent** are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on **fasting** are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning **abstinence** from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on **Good Friday** is **continued until the Easter Vigil** (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

This year, our Holy Father, Pope Francis has asked us to offer our Ash Wednesday prayer and fasting for peace in Ukraine.
