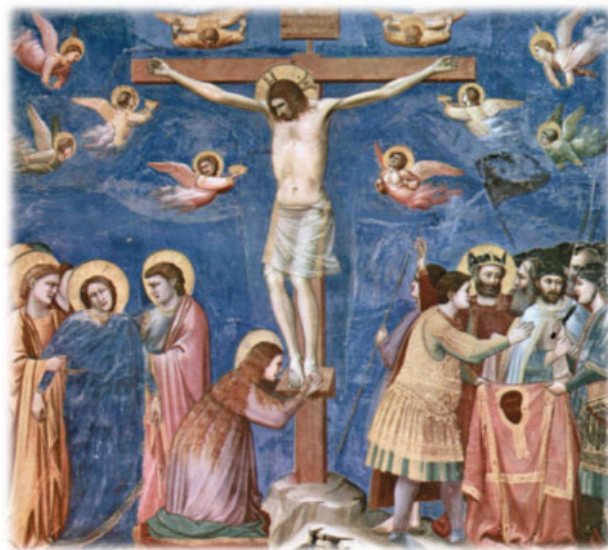

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The sacred liturgies of Holy Week are especially effective in opening for us the events of the Paschal Mystery. In my commentaries of the past few weeks, I reflected on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Today, let us consider the Easter Vigil. On Holy Saturday, the Church sits waiting at the tomb, sorrowful still for the afflictions we imposed upon our Savior. But, convinced of His power and mindful of His promise, we find hope in the darkness. The Easter Vigil is a masterwork in ironic contrast, attempting to convey both death and life in the light of the divine work of the Resurrection. I think this dynamic illustrates the role of the liturgy. The Easter Vigil is not intended to be a dramatic reenactment of the events of Christ's death and resurrection. But rather the liturgy conveys these mysteries to us in an "already-but-not-yet" format. We are ushered into these events in a sacramental manner. This means we incorporate the whole of the mystery into the whole of our prayer, instead of attempting a chronological re-telling. This mirrors the dynamic of the spiritual life, as well. We have "already" received the grace of Christ and know His friendship, but, we have "not yet" known the perfection of these which awaits the faithful in Heaven. Just so, from the start of the Vigil, we have already celebrated and experienced the resurrection (historically and sacramentally), but we do not yet fully comprehend the mystery. As such our liturgy takes us back, while being mindful of the fullness to come.

Notice the contrast, the Vigil starts solemnly in the darkness of our mourning the dead Christ. On the other hand, it cannot contain its joy from the very first moments. Yes, we assemble in darkness, but the light of a fire signals something new. The blessing of that fire already refers to the Feast of Perpetual Light that is made possible by Grace. At the start of the liturgy, the ministers wear violet as a sign of both penance and anticipation.

While in penitential garb, we already demonstrate our awareness of the resurrection to come. The paschal candle is blessed and lit as the deacon changes into a gold dalmatic to perform his sacred duty of proclaiming the light of Christ. We follow this pillar of light into the dark church and that light spreads and fills the church. The deacon chants the Easter Proclamation, the *Exultet*, and afterward, he returns to his violet vestment. In Christ's light, we listen to scriptural passages recounting the events of Salvation History.

The Blessing of Baptismal Water is worthy of study all on its own! It is rich in text as well as in ritual. By invoking the whole host of heaven, we ask God to pour out His grace by the pouring of this water. The catechumen receive the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation and the whole congregation expresses their unity with the neophytes in the renewal of baptismal promises. This is a serious occasion where we invoke the name of God and publicly make known our decision for Christian discipleship.

Afterward, the sacred ministers change into their Mass vestments and the Holy Eucharist is celebrated with full solemnity. Partaking in the Paschal Sacrament, we receive the great prize which we could never earn. But because we have opened ourselves to Christ's grace through the works of Lent and the ceremonies of the holy liturgy, we are blessed to meet the Risen Lord for ourselves in the Eucharist.

I pray that this week ahead gives you ample opportunity for reflection on all that the Lord has done for you. I sincerely hope that you will be able to personally participate with us in the liturgies that this week provides! ~Fr. O'Brien
