SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE



Before this past Easter season becomes too much of a distant memory, I wanted to feature the artistry on this year's paschal candle. Typically, we obtain paschal candles that are factory-made, and thankfully, even these are quite beautiful. This year, an artist advertised her skills and I commissioned her to paint this paschal candle uniquely for St. Patrick's.

The paschal candle is made from beeswax for its traditional symbolism of Christ-like purity. The candle is made very large so as to evoke the sight of a pillar of light. This reminds us of the one Israelites followed in the darkness through the 40 years in the desert. Of course, Christ is our light, and this is the chant of the deacon as he processes carrying the candle into the church.

The motifs on our paschal candle include an icon of Mary encountering the risen Lord, the alpha, omega, cross and date, the Celtic cross commemorating our Irish heritage. The vine pattern at the top of the candle is filled with details and signs of flourishing life. Interwoven in the vines is a banner displaying the words of the Regina Coeli, the traditional Easter hymn to our Lady.

The paschal candle is the light of Christ beckoning all people toward the Church. Through the year, the Paschal candle stands near the baptismal font guiding the unbaptized toward the womb of the Church and reminding us all of the graces we have received in our own baptism, when Christ enlightened our soul.
