### SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The Secret of Sanctity calls upon multiple sources for insights into the spiritual life. Today, allow me to summarize the instructions of Rev. de Gonnelieu, SJ, regarding the kinds of mental prayer. He writes that once we complete our preparation for meditation and are recollected, prayer can take one of three forms: prayer of affection, prayer of recollection, or prayer of contemplation.

Prayer of affection utilizes that human faculty which is, in a sense, most immediate to us, namely, our feelings. Christ, come in the flesh, appeals to our senses including our emotions to attract us to Himself. As we bring our minds to recall the events of the life of Christ, we can detect within ourselves some automatic response occurring in our feelings. For example, we can feel joy when considering His birth, we can feel awe when considering His miracles, we can feel sorrow when considering His passion. This is only the beginning of meditative prayer, but it is nonetheless, a part of meditation. Ideally, this stage of meditation will lead us to the next phase, recollection. However, if affective prayer does not move past the emotions into the will, we run the risk of reducing prayer into a sort of entertainment. You can exercise caution by not moving from one affection to another until the first has impressed itself upon your soul. We should savor each sentiment stirred by Christ's life by allowing it to move from the heart to the will. In other words, our affections should become ordered toward the higher goal of increasing our love for Christ and our resolve to follow Him more faithfully.

The prayer of recollection changes the focus of our prayer from the gifts to the giver. Just as our soul is first drawn in by the affections stirred by prayer, recollection is the soul's way of acknowledging the source of those affections. Recollection can take many forms. Beginners may be most accustomed to discursive reflection. This means to take a topic of divine revelation and examine it with the faculties of the mind. The point in this exercise is not learning, so much as listening. Mental reflection allows us to set the stage for God to speak to us. In this type of prayer, He speaks through inspirations and insights into divine topics. Perhaps we have all had an "ah ha!" moment in prayer or while listening to a homily. The conviction that stirs when our souls says, "yes, this is truth" is often the fruit of discursive prayer. Another form of recollection is restful calm as the soul acknowledges the presence of God, or in silence within us as from our depths we admit, "Thou are all, my God and I am nothing." Ultimately, recollection moves the soul to become self-forgetful, as focus upon God, and resolve to serve Him predominate the interior.

Affection is the movement of feeling within man; recollection is the meeting between man and God; contemplation is the full surrender of man to God's action. Few people experience the prayer of contemplation because it entails a full death to self, removing all obstacles to God's action within us. Once God acts to grant us contemplation, the soul experiences intimacy with Him that bears the fruit of many supernatural virtues. As a result, we "speak little and do much" while daily clinging to God detached from earthly passions. While this form of prayer is a purely a gift, let us foster it by our steadfast perseverance in prayer! ~Fr. O'Brien
