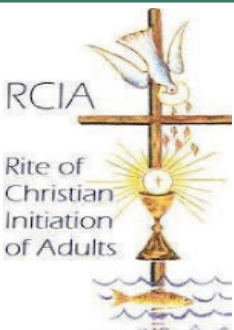

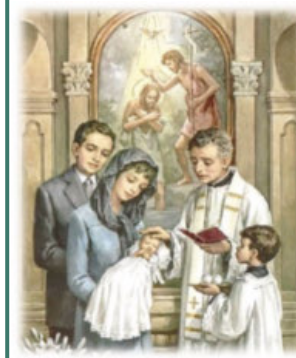

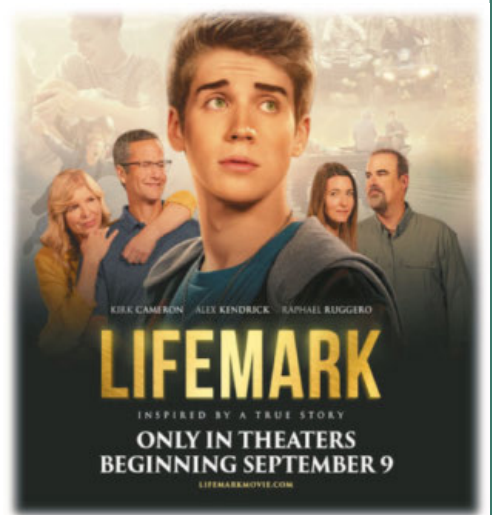


SHOUT YOUR ADOPTION

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

After convincing us of the importance of order in our spiritual lives, St. Francis de Sales then assists us to apply this order in practical ways. Let me once again summarize for you his wisdom contained in The Secret of Sanctity. The very beginning of our day can easily set the course for the way that the whole day proceeds. This is especially true of our spiritual practices. He says, “when you get up in the morning your first thought, your first word, your first action should be given to God.” Unfortunately, we all feel the temptation to sleep a little longer, but we cannot allow the flesh to be our guide. “If you parley with nature it will inevitably triumph over you.” Instead, de Sales sees in this very first battle of the day a spiritual opportunity. We are best prepared when we thoughtfully determine the hour for rising the night before and be faithful to our determination except for a serious indisposition.

Being faithful to discipline at the hour of rising is a small mortification that can be the source of graces for your day, or be the cause of the Evil One to take pleasure at our expense. “Believe me, you will lose nothing by making this little sacrifice of your rest to God; you have to do with a Master Who is magnificent in His rewards, and Who will not fail to let you reap at another time the sweet fruits of your rewards.”

Rising promptly trains our minds to put away excessive concern for our health and entrust ourselves to God, the physician of body and soul. Once we rise, we make time for God in prayer. De Sales explains, “...all the vigor of the soul depends upon morning prayer; for this reason the Evil One creates a thousand hindrances....” Rather than focus on the reasons that we should get extra rest, we should entice our minds with the riches waiting for us in our meditation. Like the Israelites of old, we should think that the graces of prayer have descended like heavenly dew, waiting for us to collect them in prayer and be sustained by their sweetness. During this morning meditation, our minds are drawn up to Christ and His mysteries. We offer Him our words, actions and thoughts of the day to come and thank Him for the blessings He bestows. We should ask to be strengthened for the combat to come particularly in reference to the sin which is our greatest weakness. We should also prepare our mind to be ready for those occasions when our primary temptation will typically arrive. In this we develop a habit and a strategy to be strong in the face of our most dangerous snare.

Much needs to be said about the content of our morning prayer. But before expanding on this topic, de Sales stirs up our conviction about the importance of prayer. The enemy will exploit our every weakness to cause us to think less of prayer. However, de Sales asks, “Would you be willing to spend a day without eating? What has your soul done that you should treat it more cruelly and harshly than you treat your body?... Do you think you can live without food, fight without arms, fly without wings, labor without strength? Whence do you derive all this if not from prayer?” Notice how de Sales’ words of encouragement to pray emphasize the blessings that await us in prayer. Yes, prayer can often feel like a duty, but let us not forget the rewards that our Father has waiting for us as we approach Him! ~Fr. O’Brien

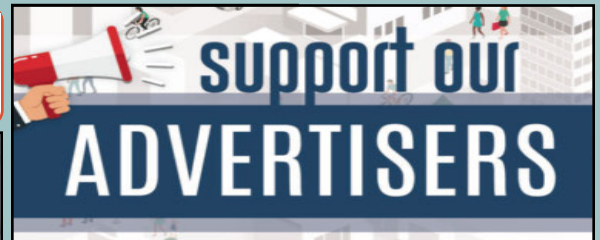
