Please allow me to continue to convey the reflections of St. Francis de Sales compiled in the work <u>The Secret of Sanctity</u>. We have already seen his advice on the role of order in the spiritual life. Once that order is sought, it gradually forms the foundation upon which the many elements of the spiritual life can be built. The order of the spiritual life touches every aspect of our experience as human beings. Consider his thoughts on how spiritual order can influence daily labor. He says that followers of Christ will dedicate themselves to their labors energetically and seek a pure intention in all things while seeking to contribute to the good of those around us.

Examining our intention while we carry out our duties is especially significant. He says, "Do not forget that the most indifferent actions acquire, through fervent intention, inappreciable merit for eternity." In order to keep a holy intention in our daily tasks he recommends frequent brief mental prayers such as, "Thy will be done," or "have mercy on me a sinner," or "Ave Maria" to name a few.

Spiritual order can also influence our devotion to the Sacrament of Confession. De Sales recommends confessing every two weeks and preparing for the sacrament in advance. This preparation should help us to accurately recount our sins in number and kind, but preparation should also excite within us sincere contrition for these faults. He calls the latter duty more important than the former.

Eucharistic devotion is of the utmost importance for the spiritual life. About the reception of Holy Communion, he writes, "bring to this great action all the devotion and care of which you are capable..." Since this moment is a true meeting between God and ourselves, we rightly seek to give it the highest kind of order, that is, all our attention and effort. That interior disposition which we bring to Holy Communion is most importantly humility. He says, "...remember that the disposition God asks of you is not sensible fervor, which is not always in your power, but profound humility and a sincere desire to be united with Him." While the emotions we experience regarding the gift of the Eucharist vary due to our fallen state, it is within our power to invite the presence of God in our souls and issue Him the humble invitation to be our King in all things.

Next, if we foster these attitudes in our individual work and our individual devotion to the sacraments, then we should also consider how we will be noticed by the people around us. Our witness of devotion should be an attractive one. He writes, "endeavor to make piety loved through you. Avoid with the greatest care that spirit of criticism, those little jealousies, petty weaknesses, and caprices which many vainly seek to reconcile with true piety." Spiritual order is aimed to cultivate the presence of Christian charity in the soul. Charity will help us to address problems with forbearance, to tolerate faults with tenderness, and to accept sufferings with childlike faith. He goes on to say that charity will aid us to find the mean between "unseemly levity and repellant austerity." Christians seek to foster politeness which bear the fruit of "delicate courtesy, thoughtful consideration and simple, modest bearing." May the prayers of St. Francis de Sales enable us to foster a sanctified order within every aspect of our lives. ~Fr. O'Brien
