National Black Catholic History Month



When just a little girl, Saint Josephine Bakhita (Bah-KEE-tah), was kidnapped from her loving family in the Sudan, and sold into brutal slavery. Her different "owners" frequently beat and tortured her. Finally when she was sold to an Italian diplomat, at age 14, St. Josephine Bakhita received Christian instruction for the first time from the Sisters of Charity in Venice, Italy. Later, when the diplomat's family returned to Africa, Saint Josephine Bakhita refused to go with them. She remained within the protection of the Sisters' convent in Italy, where slavery was illegal. For

the next 50 years, she joyfully and faithfully served as the convent's cook, seamstress, sacristan, and doorkeeper until her death in 1947.

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Summarizing <u>The Secret of Sanctity</u>, I've been able to present some foundational ideas about our personal lives of prayer and engagement with the sacramental life. In this next section of the work, I look forward to going deeper into St. Francis de Sales' reflections concerning fruitful participation in the Holy Mass.

He start with no uncertain terms, "There is no worship on earth which renders as much honor to God as the sacrifice of the Mass. Hence, we should consider this action as the most important of our life, and accomplish it as perfectly as possible." It is only reasonable to approach the altar of God with holy fear and to depart from it with "ineffable gratitude." We should consider the unique place of the priest: a man chosen by God and the Church to serve as mediator. The priest is both sacrificer and victim. The priest stands in the place of the whole Church as she offers herself to the Father in union with Christ.

The faithful can bestir their devotion and attention by regarding the priest as the very Son of God who ascends to the altar to carry out the sacrifice which saves them. We should attend the Holy Mass with purity of heart and soul. But, be reminded, that even unfortunate souls burdened with mortal sin should still attend, while abstaining from Holy Communion, and praying confidently for conversion.

Each moment of the Mass can evoke for us a moment of the life of Christ. Calling this to mind can keep us engaged with the sacred action as well as deepen our conviction about the significance of what we are witnessing. In the end, de Sales encourages his reader to employ the method of prayer which best inflames one's devotion. "Go to the church, like the shepherds, to seek the infant Jesus: or, like the Blessed Virgin, to Calvary to assist at the death of our divine Saviour, in order to offer Him as a sacrifice for the salvation of the world; or like the three apostles on Mount Tabor, to behold him transfigured."

As the Mass begins, think of yourself like a criminal before God as your judge. Silently confess your sins to Him while the priest prays the *confiteor*. Then, hearing words of mercy, we are prepared to rejoice with the angelic hymn of *Gloria*. The words of this hymn proceed from scripture and tradition. As we join our voices to this endless canticle of praise, we can also ask God that our interior lives would be filled with the joy it contains. Praise acknowledges God's surpassing greatness, it lifts up our heart and it stirs us to ensure that others come to know His majesty, as well. During the epistle and Gospel chants, listen with devotion. Even if there is something we cannot understand, de Sales reminds us we can pray for the conversion and faith for those who do not believe.

The *Credo* gives us another chance to unite our own voice to the one timeless voice of the Church. Much more than a mere element of ritual, singing the *Credo* is our opportunity to ascent to the revealed truth of God transmitted to us through the Church's magisterium. We remind ourselves of the trinitarian nature of the one God. We are His creatures; out of love He sent His Son to redeem and save us; with great care the Holy Spirit communicates divine life to us that we may be sanctified. In short, PRAY the Holy Mass! ~Fr.
