National Black Catholic History Month



St. Martin de Porres (1579-1639) was born out of wedlock to a white father and Black mother. He trained as a barber (which included learning medicine) and tried to enter the Dominican order but was denied because it was illegal for a Black man to make vows. He entered as a volunteer instead and was so holy (in spite of the racist treatment he endured at the hands of the other brothers) that his superior decided to defy the law and allow Martin to become a lay brother. He worked in the kitchen and the infirmary for the

rest of his life, a healer and a miracle-worker who bilocated all over

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

During this month of November, we recall the glory of the saints and our duty to pray for those who have died but who await their eternal reward. These are two essential elements of the same theological reality. We are both enflamed with joyful hope at the glory now bestowed upon the saints in heaven, while at the same time, we acknowledge the suffering of those in Purgatory who are in need of our prayers and sacrifices.

Our joy about the saints and our duty toward the suffering, cause us to confront our own mortality, as well. As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the Church wants the end of our earthly life to be prayerfully on our minds. The secular sphere understands the value of doing something well. Only the best athletes become Olympians; only the most talented become rich and famous. But, it completely fails to consider what is best when it comes to our own death. The world can only suggest a temporary escape from death through pleasure, etc. Our faith, however, and it alone offers the solution to death and therefore we, as Christians, do not shrink from reflecting on how to live well and, yes, to die well. Is not this the very reason we invoke our Lady so frequently saying, "pray for us now and at the hour of our death?"

I considered this task anew when reading <u>The Secret of</u> <u>Sanctity</u> a few months back. In it, St. Francis de Sales recommends to us this monthly exercise, "Select a day each month to prepare yourself for death, and on that day perform each duty as faithfully as if it were to be the last of your life. Go to confession and receive Communion as viaticum. Examine what might trouble you at such an hour: unjust possessions, doubts, restitutions unmade, unreconciled quarrels, etc. Repeat the acts made by the dying: acts of resignation, acts of accepting the time, the place, the manner of the death God wishes you to die; acts of thanksgiving, of lively faith, of hope, of confidence, of sincere sorrow, of love of God, etc. Invoke Jesus crucified; implore the Blessed Virgin, your angel guardian, your patron saint, to plead for you, and when you lie down to rest, regard your bed as your tomb."

Taking de Sales' advice is far from a morbid preoccupation. Quite the opposite! Preparing for our own death can be a source of peace and confidence to invigorate our daily life even as our inevitable end approaches. In short, being prepared to endure well on our ultimate day of judgement is very profitable for making the most of each day we have on earth. For the faithful, death is not a frightful unknown, but rather, in Christ we have a hope established in divine sacrifice. Therefore, our growth in virtue and the endurance of trials on earth only adds to the reward we hope for after death. Preparing well for the day of our death serves to increase our reliance upon the Lord, for, truly, He is our only hope on that great day. Thus, we are more inclined to entrust ourselves fully to Him as daily life carries on. Being in touch with the one reliable source of hope that is found on the last day will confirm our desire and our zeal to share the cause of our hope with others as well. Don't the martyrs show us that dying well is evangelical?

Considering our own mortality and preparing well for our final day is both a source of great blessings and a serious duty. Done well, we will even become joyful in the face of small daily deaths that our vocations require. ~Fr. O'Brien
