SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Two Sundays remain before the start of Lent. While our city is enthralled in the pleasures of Mardi Gras, let us not neglect the opportunity to prepare for Lent so that our Easter may be a time of spiritual delights! Each year the three pillars of Lenten penance are proclaimed starting on Ash Wednesday. Those are **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**. I would like to spend the next three weeks reflecting on these three spiritual tools so as to show how they will yield blessings for us when the Feast of Feasts arrives.

Today, let us consider prayer. The Catechism cites St. Thérèse of Lisieux to begin its section on prayer, 2558. She writes, "For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and love, embracing both trial and joy." For Thérèse, the life of prayer seeks to bestir a friendship with God. It is time spent with a lover to rejoice in consolations, to share the burden of suffering. We do well to learn from her even if it may take us a lifetime! We can learn from her a fundamental disposition toward prayer. Not only is it true that we owe prayer to God; after all He is our Creator and all our time and skill comes from Him, but He has shown Himself to be a Father to us as well. Thérèse teaches us to approach prayer with a child-like confidence that God will use our efforts of prayer to be a source of blessings in our life. With this conviction, we should experience an enticement toward prayer.

As Lent approaches, let us all take a close look at our prayer life and resolve to take a new step in prayer during our 40 days of preparation. Lent can be a time to increase our time in prayer, to renew our current routine, or to try a different practice of prayer. As you discern the right penance for your upcoming Lent, allow me to propose two forms of prayer which incorporate Scripture for your consideration.

Prayer of Recitation has been a standard of Judeo-Christian prayer for millennia. Christ Himself recited the Sacred Scriptures as an observant Jew. Priests and religious are committed to reciting the Scriptures at least 5 times a day in prayer. Lay people as well can join in the Liturgy of the Hours, the Roman Breviary, or the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary so as to bring the Psalms and other sacred texts into your prayer. The advantages of this kind of prayer abound! First, familiarity with scripture forms us. It allows us to see God through the lens of divine revelation rather than through imagination alone. Reciting scripture cultivates a divine vocabulary and gives us a framework in which all human experiences can be interpreted and connected to God. Reciting Scripture is sacrificial as well; when we pray the words of Scripture, we offer the Word of God to the Father to obtain grace and salvation. This is the prayer of Christ!

Prayer of Meditation petitions God for personal insight as we spend time with the sacred texts. Often called *Lectio Divina*, the many meanings of Sacred Scripture can be unveiled for us as we mull on the text and listen to God's inspirations. Simply put, this process involves reading a short text several times while asking basic questions. For example: What is God revealing about Himself in this text? Where do I see the love of God in this text? What is God asking of me in this text? May your Lenten efforts of prayer produce great fruit! ~Fr. O'Brien
