

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Last week, I offered some reflections regarding the first pillar of Lenten penance, that of prayer. With our rich tradition to encourage us, we can take stock of the abundant fruit that these practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving have yielded for the sanctification of souls. Remember, penance is not the same as punishment! It is true, penance is a result of our sinfulness, yet, voluntary penance takes on the character of an act of love offered to repair the relationship between us and God while reforming our hearts to be a better lover toward Him Who loved us first!

Thus enticed to take on penances this coming Lent, today, I would like to dive deeper on the subject of fasting. In its teaching on fasting, the Catechism first recalls the 40 days of fasting completed by our Lord in the desert. This both fulfills the fasting of Moses prior to receiving God's law, and sets the stage for Christ to undo the rebellion of Adam when he fell to the temptation in the Garden. Right after His 40 days of fast, Christ was tempted, but resisted the snares of the evil one so as to be obedient to God. Thus, when we fast, we do so in imitation of Christ who shows us that spiritual strength comes through poverty of material things (CCC 538). The Catechism goes on to clarify that fasting is truly obligatory for Catholics by means of the precepts of the Church (CCC 2041ff.). The five precepts which bind us formulate a "very necessary minimum" for the health of our spiritual lives. Fasting conforms us to the life of Christ, increases our self-mastery (and therefore our freedom), and prepares us for the feasts which mark our liturgical year.

Canon Law (cann. 1249– 1253) clarifies our obligation toward fast and abstinence during Lent. First, there are two days of obligatory fast: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days, Catholics between 18 and 59 inclusive are obliged to fast and abstain from meat. To fast from food on these days means, at a minimum, to take only meal (meatless), and, if necessary, to take one or two smaller meals which together do not equal more than a full meal. If anything needs to be taken between means, it must be liquid only. Recommended by the US bishops is the Paschal Fast: observing a fast from the liturgy of Holy Thursday until the conclusion of the Easter Vigil.

Abstinence from meat is required of all Catholic 14 years of age and older on the Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that we will not eat warm-blooded animal flesh on these days, nor the by-products of meat which contain meat flavor, such as chicken stock, etc. Dairy products, eggs, shortening of animal fat, and cold-blooded animals are permitted on days of abstinence.

Living in south Louisiana makes it very easy to observe these abstinence regulations, so much so, that they can be an occasion of excess! For that reason, it is vital to reflect upon the spiritual intent of these measures of fast: self-denial is a bodily way to imitate the Lord so that, by our obedient fasting, we can undo the damage of the disobedient feasting of Adam. This Lent, go above and beyond these minimum feasting regulations so as to attach yourself to the better things which God promises! Select your own personalized fasting penance so that the good things of Easter may be yours in abundance!
