






The three Sundays prior to Ash Wednesday form a transition period between two liturgical seasons. Now that our celebrations of Christmas have finished, we are directed now toward Lent, our allimportant preparation for the Feast of Feasts, Easter. By the year 541, these three weeks prior to Lent were known collectively as Septuagesima, a tradition retained in the classical calendar of Roman rite (1962). Each of the three Sundays has its proper name: Septuagesima, Sexigesima, and Quinquagesima.

The season of Lent is a 40 day preparation for Easter. The number 40 recalls many biblical facts such as the 40 years the Israelites wandered the desert, and the 40 days our Lord fasted. In most western languages, the name of Lent derives from the number 40 such as the Latin "Quadragesima," the French "Carême," or the Spanish "Cuaresma." The word Septuagesima refers to the number 70, and evokes memories of Israel's exile from Jerusalem for 70 years during the Babylonian exile (605—538 B.C.). While the counting of days is not exactly 70 days before Easter, Septuagesima Sunday gives us the chance to mourn the many times that mankind has fallen from grace and lost God's favor.

Septuagesima is observed as a time of transition to acclimate our hearts into Lent. For that reason some of Lent's austerities are already observed while others are not. For example, in the liturgy, we abstain from the Gloria and the Alleluia. We also begin the fast visually by not using flowers on the altar and violet vestments are worn. However, other rigors are not yet observed. There is no requirement of fasting or abstinence during Septuagesima. Dom Guéranger reflects on the good fruits to be expected from a faithful observance of Septuagesima, "We have now a clearer knowledge of the justice and holiness of God, and of the dangers that await an impenitent soul; and, that our repentance might be earnest and lasting, we have bade farewell to the vain joys and baubles of the world. Our pride has been humbled by the prophecy, that these bodies would soon be like the ashes that wrote the memento of death upon our foreheads."
