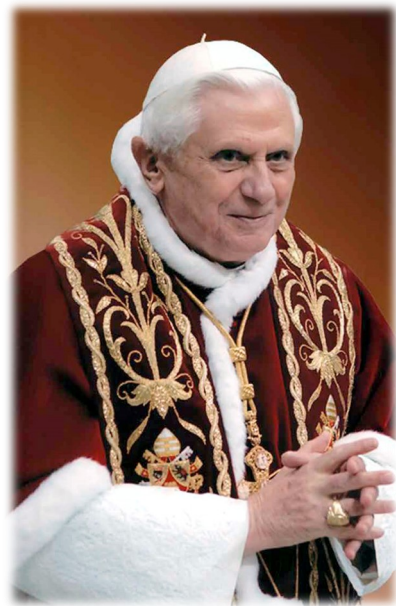

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

After the graces of the Christmas season, we now proceed into the time after the Epiphany when the reality of Christ's presence in our midst is continually unfolded for us through the year. Before Christmas, I shared with you some reflections of St. Francis de Sales about how to better participate in the Holy Mass with interior focus on the divine mystery unfolding liturgically. I resume today with The Secret of Sanctity and its reflections on the readings of the Mass. It is not uncommon to have difficulty understanding the readings due to their content or their language. In those moments, we should remind ourselves that God's revelation is truly beyond our comprehension, but yet, the Lord will gradually enlighten our minds. Moreover, we are prompted in that moment to pray for those who choose not to understand the Gospel, may they be converted from the burden of their errors.

After listening to the homily, we respond with our profession of faith. While the text is a long one, the overarching structure of the Creed is trinitarian: one God, three persons. In this moment we publicly reaffirm our faith in union with the body of believers. Next, the Mass proceeds with the offertory. While the priest offers the bread and wine, de Sales recommends, "place your body, your soul, your mind, your heart, your possessions, your hopes, your family, your friends, and all your desires upon the paten of the priest. Present them to God to be immolated to Him with the body of His only Son in a perfect holocaust and odor of sweetness. Beg God to change and transform you as completely as the bread and wine are changed and transformed into His body and blood."

The Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer gives us a chance to unite our sacrifice to the praise of the Church. In it, we join our minds to the particular mystery being celebrated that Sunday while joining our voices to the angels to chant "*Sanctus!*" From that point until the consecration, de Sales instructs us to meditate upon the various aspects of the passion of Christ, the fruit of which we are about to adore in the elevation of the sacred species.

While the priest elevates the sacred Host, "do not remain cold and unmoved, but adore your Lord with body and mind." At that moment we stir within ourselves sentiments of gratitude, respect, worship and love. The moment between the elevation of the Precious Body and Precious Blood is particularly rich for meditation. The Blood of the Lord is consecrated separately from His Body. This separation of Body and Blood accomplishes the immolation of the victim: when blood is separated from body death occurs. The death of our Lord, therefore, is made sacramentally and really present for us in that moment. His self-sacrifice is the source from which all graces flow and salvation is made possible for mankind.

Lifetimes worth of sacred thoughts are available to us during the elevations, but as we invite the holy fruits of His passion into our lives we proceed with the Mass thinking of the four ends of the Mass: adoration, thanksgiving, forgiveness of sins, and petitioning for the obtaining of graces we need for sanctity.

The graces we receive from the Mass are limitless, therefore let us ask our Blessed Mother for the gift of true prayer and meditation on mysteries before us! ~Fr. O'Brien
