



### SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The number 40 has many significations in Sacred Scripture. For Catholics, perhaps the most famous '40' is our observance of Lent for 40 days. But the number 40 also has a meaning in the Christmas context as well. 40 days after Christmas concludes on February 2, and it is the day when the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord.

This great feast contains the intersection of many mysteries. First, our Lady's devout observance of the Jewish law which stipulated that she should come to the temple to be purified 40 days following childbirth. Of course, Mary had no need of purification, but undertook this act and offered the required sacrifice, to display the virtue of obedience and to demonstrate her Son's condescension among His people.

The entrance of the Lord into the temple also stirs deep wonder. For centuries, the temple was the pride of Israel. It was their most beautiful and impressive building and the visible sign of God dwelling in their midst since it contained the Holy of Holies—the place of sacrifice. But now, the presence of God fills the temple enrobed in flesh setting on His way to eventually make Himself the new sacrifice for the salvation of Jews and Gentiles. He comes not in battle array, nor on the clouds, but carried unnoticed by a humble virgin, protected by Joseph the just man.

The living prophet Simeon and the prophetess Anna realize the significance of this moment and rejoice to meet the Savior. Simeon foretells that this Child will see the rise and fall of many and the cause of a sword to pierce the heart of His mother. Yet, nonetheless, there is true cause to rejoice since the light has come. Rest can now come to the old man, Simeon, and peace is made available for His people.

To commemorate the continued unfolding of the meaning of Christ's birth, the Church prescribes the blessing of candles. The ceremony beautifully marks the occasion with 5 prayers of blessing and a procession. **Parishioners are welcomed to bring their own candles from home to be blessed, or take some provided by St. Patrick's for a donation.** Having blessed candles in the home is a visible way that to be mindful of the heavenly light which our Savior came to bring.

Please plan to attend our solemn celebration of Candlemas, February 2nd at 6 p.m. Note the earlier-thanusual start time!

Many in our wider culture know February 2nd as Groundhog Day. Little do they know that the sacred feast of the Presentation is the origin of the secular observance! February 2nd is roughly the midpoint of winter and has great relevance for agricultural societies as they plan for the planting season. There was an old English poem which prognosticated about the arrival of spring based on the weather on Candlemas. This created traditions among various people whereby an animal would be a sign of the start of spring. For the English, it was a bear, for the Germans it was a badger. When the settlers found their home in Pennsylvania, the abundant groundhogs received the honor of ceremoniously foretelling the spring.

The divine mysteries of our faith are meant to guide not only our Sundays, but the very changing of the seasons and, indeed, our daily lives! Invite the light of Christ by joining us for this solemn and meaningful liturgy. ~Fr. O'Brien
