SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

In this Easter Season, it is important to look for the ways that the graces won for us by Christ are having an impact in our lives. These graces are meant to sustain us in this present life, sanctify us that we may be more like Christ, and keep us steadfast on the path to eternal life. Therefore, we cannot let the Easter season float by unnoticed! If Lent is a time of increased rigor, may our Easter be spent taking stock and fostering the good fruit Christ has provided.

The wisdom of the spiritual masters and Catechism help us to be programmatic about our pursuit of holiness. There is a structure by which our conversion and sanctification grows and develops, namely by means of the virtues. The Catechism says, “A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good.” (1803) Citing St. Gregory of Nyssa, the Catechism reminds us, “The goal of a virtuous life is to become like God.” This orientation toward the good can be broken down into two categories: the good in relation to God and the good in relation to our fellow man. Those virtues pertaining to the former category are called the theological virtues, while the latter are the moral, or cardinal virtues.

The first theological virtue is faith. Faith is an infused gift, meaning that it is the result of grace received. Because it allows us to engage with supernatural truth, faith is rightly called a supernatural virtue. This means that nothing worldly can produce it. Faith is the ascent of the intellect which allows us to see as true all that God has revealed. Scripture says that faith is “evidence of things unseen.” When, by grace, we perceive such evidence, our response is an act of the will: to ascent to it by a movement of our intellect. Recall the revelations and miracles recorded in Scripture. These did not automatically produce faith in all who witnessed. Therefore, on our part, we must perceive these things and ascend to the truth they convey. Giving ascent is a skill, a disposition toward the good, which can be fostered by acting on faith, or by regulating the information we are exposed to, etc. but there is no substitute for grace!

The virtue of faith is gravely harmed by heresy and apostasy. One whose faith is infected with heresy cannot be said to possess the virtue of faith. Instead, they have happened upon correct opinions to whatever degree they believe the truth. May God deliver them and judge their errors with mercy! For our part, we must protect our faith from all compromise; recall our Lord teaches us faith is necessary for salvation. Faith also bears the good fruit of attention to divine things; we are able to notice divine truth and divine presence even in natural realities. Faith also orders our lives with the correct priorities: God first, then others, then the self—this is the order of charity which impels us toward moral living as well.

Our faith is harmed by blasphemy, engagement of worldly goods without reference to their eternal implications, lack of spiritual study, rash credulity (superstition), indifferentism (the thought that all creeds are equally valid), passing on information which may be inaccurate.

We can foster the virtue of faith by making an act of faith in prayer, teaching and studying the faith, celebrating our faith well liturgically, avoiding media and relationships that distract from the faith, sacrificing as an act of intercession for greater faith, and also Devotion to Mary and the Sacred Heart. ~Fr.
