SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Before continuing my series on the virtues, I would like to express my gratitude to the several parishioners who assisted with the disturbance we experienced on our campus last Sunday. Thank you, as well, to those who reached out to express their concern! Unfortunately, an encounter with an individual resulted in damage to our angel statue near the memorial to the unborn. Before more damage could be done, some parishioners who were nearby intervened and their presence was enough to dissuade the individual from doing further harm. The police responded quickly and resolved the situation. Encountering distraught individuals is all too common in our neighborhood. This is a good opportunity for me to remind everyone to stay vigilant and speak up if something seems out of place. Our ushers at Mass have a plan to respond to any safety concern and we employ a security guard at each of our Masses. Funds from our parish poor box are used to supply essential needs for those who call at the parish office (water, small snack, bus tickets), and funds are directed toward local organizations who assist those in distress. To our vigilance let us join our prayers so that we may continue to shine the charity of Christ to our city and our world!

As we near the end of this Easter Season, we recall that the graces obtained for us by Christ lead us toward perfection. The habits by which we become perfected are summarized by the seven virtues. The second cardinal virtue, which I present today, is justice. Justice pertains to what is due. It invokes the rights of individuals and orders society toward the fulfillment of rights by imposing corresponding responsibilities. Justice is enacted not only between individuals, but from society toward the individual and vice versa. Justice, in the supernatural order, also regulates our responsibilities to fulfill the rights of God. Supernatural justice is carried out by the sub-virtue of religion. By it, we attempt to render to God what is His due. Humanly speaking, we offer to Him worship that is the very best of our efforts and capacities (ritual, art, language, etc). But even these result from the grace He gives us. Thus, our natural attempts toward the virtue of religion must be united to a supernatural work to fulfill justice toward God. No human person could fulfill justice toward God, that is why our worship must be united to the worship rendered to the Father by the Son, a Divine Person who took on our nature. The Mass is our only hope to give God what is His due, since by the Mass we enter into the prayer of Christ upon the Cross. Just as individuals owe worship to God, so too does society. That is why Catholicism does not acknowledge the necessity of separation of Church and state, nor a right of individuals to engage in other religions.

Another sub-virtue of justice is the virtue of devotion whereby we respond to our duties toward God with promptness. Piety demands that we render to those above us (such as parents or Church hierarchy) and those below (children, etc.) the honor that is due. Obedience belongs under justice, and it becomes perfected when we carry out instructions even beyond the right of the one instructing (within prudence). Diligence fulfills justice because it completes our duties according to our state in life. Gratitude is a virtue because it gives due appreciation for a blessing, temporal or spiritual. The virtues of truthfulness, friendship and liberality (generosity to those in need) fulfill justice because by them we acknowledge our debt to our fellow man because of the dignity given them by God.

Compromising justice is oversensitivity toward human respect because it places too much focus on the analysis of others beyond their right to analyze us. Theft and other crimes are obvious violations of justice. But also judging, murmuring, and derision violate the rights of others to autonomy and a reputation untarnished without serious cause. On the spiritual plane, we must protect justice against sacrilege and simony by which sacred things are used for profane or abusive purposes. Likewise, superstition harms justice because, by it we grasp for spiritual gifts in a way against God's will. ~Fr. O'Brien
