SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

My heartfelt congratulations to our newly confirmed parishioners! It was truly an uplifting celebration to call down the Holy Spirit upon our parish teens. A very special word of gratitude to Archbishop Aymond for supporting our Latin Mass community and to Canon Matthew Talarico for accepting our invitation to administer the Sacrament!

To continue my series on the virtues, let us consider today the virtue of temperance. The Catechism tells us that temperance “moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods.” (1809) By it we develop mastery over our instincts and appetites so as to be free to make our choices with full deliberation and reason. The effects of temperance instill within us a habit of keeping our senses well ordered. In other words, our senses are disciplined to serve our spiritual sanctification rather than dominating over our will to the detriment of our soul.

The following are subvirtues of temperance. *Honestia* is the consistent pursuit of the virtuous things in all areas of life. Abstinence disciplines our will from attachment to certain foods; fasting accomplishes the same, but in regard to all food. In order for these two to become virtues, they need to be done for the sake of God, and practiced regularly until the soul is habituated toward them. Sobriety helps us to avoid both too much and too little regarding legitimate pleasures. Modesty, continence and chastity are present with a virtuous exercise of the sexual faculty. The virtue of purity orients us toward the spiritual beauty which is present when we refrain from impure temporal consolations.

Clemency and meekness moderate our interior life and external social interactions. These help us to avoid the delight that can come from permitting anger within, and orient us against vengeance. Temperance in regard to recreation is called eutrapelia. The virtue of sportsmanship is the virtue by which we recoil from excessive celebration as well as prevent feeling devastated by a loss. Decorum moderates speech and action in social settings. The virtue of silence can be fostered by avoiding any unnecessary speech. The virtue of silence can also direct both our daily actions and our interior atmosphere which we maintain throughout the day. For example, proper comportment and calmness of mind demonstrate that we are directing ourselves with intentionality; all our choices are ordered toward the better and the best, for God’s glory. The virtue of simplicity tempers our desire for possessions such that we do not accumulate what is not useful for our state in life.

All these virtues are to be lived according to one’s own vocation. A monk will have a different exercise of simplicity, than a married woman, for example. To be clear, temperance is not a condemnation of what is pleasurable. Instead, it strengthens us to avoid attachment to pleasure, and avoid being motivated by pleasure alone. Temperance permits us to seek a truly good end in all our choices rather than seeking pleasure as our end.

The excesses of the appetites are contrary to temperance: gluttony, anger, excessive sorrow, pride (satisfaction at one’s excellences), curiosity, and crudity (being socially unmannered). These demonstrate that our appetites are controlling us rather than freely directing all things to God’s glory. ~Fr. O’Brien
