SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The third theological virtue is charity. Stated simply, charity is friendship between God and man. In Christ, we can now have a common life with God, and hope to enjoy it perfected in heaven. In this light, true charity is a grace since it is possible only because of what Christ accomplished through His passion. Our charity toward God can never match what is due to God, but we can perfect our charity as we love God for Who He is, rather than what He does for us. Now, this present life, is our opportunity to grow in charity because, should we arrive in heaven, at that point, the extent of our charity will be fixed. Mortal sin extinguishes charity within us, turning off our common life with God. The first stage of charity to God is resistance against even slight sin; the spiritually proficient then, long to grow in God's love; the perfect seek to love God alone and to love others because of Him, losing themselves in God.

When the virtue of charity is directed toward neighbors, we love them for God's sake. God extends charity toward us to the extent that we reflect Him. Thus, the greater we love others and love God, the more of His charity He shares with us. This also clarifies for us how to love ourselves. We are loveable not merely for our skills or accomplishments, but rather because we are creatures of God whom He loves. We do ourselves a disservice by attempting to love what is ungodly about ourselves. Instead, we seek transformation in His love that we may resemble Him more and more.

With a properly ordered love of God and love of self, we will have a font from which to draw as we love others. We are called to love everyone, but not everyone equally. The greater someone resembles God, the greater claim they have on our love. Thus, our love for Our Lady must take a unique priority. Our duty of charity is greater as someone is more proximate to us, such as a spouse, child or friend. Keep in mind, love for self is not the same as love for our own earthly existence. Great charity is expressed by laying down one's life for another. But one's own spiritual life may never be sacrificed for any reason. At the same time, we can love our enemy even if they do not much resemble God. After all, the presence of God is still within then, and our love for our enemy is ultimately given for God's sake. To hate a person is to deny the image of God in them and it is a compromise of our love for God. Charity depends on correct faith and hope. If we do not know the true by faith and the good by hope, then our love will be misguided.

In addition to hatred, charity is harmed by spiritual sloth since it entails excessive love for worldly pleasures and too little love for the good things of God. Envy, or sorrow at another's good, harms charity because we deny the goodness of the action of God in another's life. Contention and argumentativeness harm charity because they offend the unity of God's people.

To increase our charity, we can tell God we love Him through praying an "act of charity," spontaneous or otherwise. Performing good works for others, let us stir our intention to love God by those works. Mortification deepens our love for Godly things by detaching from the worldly. Recourse to the Sacred Heart, the "burning furnace of charity" allows us to see that love is an energizing motive with us, an inner impulse that leads us to fulfillment and delight in Godliness. ~Fr.
