SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

For my final installment in this series on virtues, let me remind you that virtues are habits. They are fundamental inclinations which we develop in our minds and wills whereby we choose what is good and excellent. We all have a moment of doing a good deed, or exercising self-control. However, the grace of Christ offered to us in the Easter season is a transforming grace, such that we are truly changed by it. As we grow in virtues, they become as natural to us as our vices once were. In this we can see proof that God's sanctification is taking root in us—in totality we can become like Christ even at the level of our impulses, dispositions and habits.

Today's virtue is prudence. Simply put, prudence judges what is the best way for us to reach the goal we have in mind. This helps us to discern the question "how?" If the end we have in mind to accomplish is a natural one like learning to play chess, then the natural virtue of prudence would tell us to watch the masters. If the end we have in mind is a supernatural one, like to imitate the joyful poverty of St. Francis, or the dedication to theology of St. Thomas Aquinas, then grace will be required to exercise the supernatural virtue of prudence.

In order to accomplish a goal (an end), we first apply right reason. This means we need mental clarity on good and evil, morality and revelation. To right reason, we add judgement of principles. Prudence requires us to balance competing needs and alternate possibilities to determine which principles would be most effective in our present situation. With reason and judgement united, we can see the right thing to do in the right circumstances. We may have the noble end of converting a sinner, but if that sinner is threatening my family, prudence would direct me to prioritize the safety of those I love.

Prudence requires a clarity of the interior life since we often have to bring together knowledge with past experiences plus imagination which would help us forecast the effects of our choices. For this reason, subvirtues of prudence start in the interior life. The virtue of memory helps us recall the effects of past choices. An active alcoholic lacks the virtue of memory because he fails to keep in mind the misery that drunkenness brings after the high subsides. The virtue of understanding governs our insight of right and wrong and the true effect of one act compared to another. Caution helps us apply the lessons of the past; foresight enlightens potential outcomes, and circumspection allows us to be ever mindful of our circumstances before deciding to act.

External subvirtues of prudence are docility, meaning the habit of allowing oneself to be led when fitting. Counsel disposes us toward the good advice of others. Shrewdness is the ability to arrive quickly at the right decision. Contrary virtues are inconstancy, and negligence whereby we act without consideration of the whole. Craftiness and guile undermine true prudence because they aim to accomplish a goal in a manner that is two-faced or deceptive.

Prudence is sometimes referred to as the queen of the moral virtues. Prudence helps us determine how much of the other virtues to apply: too much temperance and we will starve to death, or too much justice and the perfect seems unattainable. Prudence reins in and directs our whole pallet of virtues so that the best goal can be accomplished by the best means. ~Fr. O
