# SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

I would like to begin a new bulletin series on a book I recently came across by Abbe Claude Barthe titled <u>A Forest of Symbols</u>. In it, Abbe Barthe thoroughly examines the rituals of the Mass to discern in them the various layers of meaning which are meant to edify our soul and give greater honor to God. Today, allow me to summarize his insights regarding the sacred context in which the worship of God takes place: the church building. In the Old Testament, there were many places where various kinds of worship were carried out (Mt. Sinai, synagogues, the Jerusalem Temple). But in the New Covenant, there is no longer any need for a Temple, because the Savior Himself will be the Temple (Rev. 21:22). Therefore, Christ's body (both His physical and His Mystical Body) is the ultimate place of worship.

We rightly call the physical structure where Christian worship occurs a "church" because it represents Christ's physical body—it is not just a worship space, or gathering hall. In the physical structure of the church building is the fitting place for the Mystical Body of Christ, the people of God, the Church, to assemble for worship. Just as members of the Mystical Body are baptized and consecrated, so too are church buildings consecrated with a solemn rite which includes the sprinkling of specially blessed Holy Water and 12 anointings to symbolize the 12 apostles.

In contrast to pagan temples, the Temple of Jerusalem had a dedicated area where the people were welcome to enter. Separated from that area, the Temple also housed the Holy of Holies where God dwelt and the most solemn offerings were made. Churches fulfill this symbolism in that the people of God are welcome into the church building and given access to the holiest place. At the same time, the sanctuary of a church is a place set apart for the sacred action and the God's presence, the Blessed Sacrament. By the distinction of sanctuary and nave, the church building symbolizes the body Christ: the Church, both head and members. Christ alone is the head, this is shown by the church sanctuary where, during the liturgy, only males may serve. Christ is also present in the plurality of His members. They are the body who assemble in the nave of the church.

Not only does the church building facilitate symbolism for the presence of Christ: physically and mystically, but also the church building shows what the body is doing. First the eastward orientation of the church (whereby the assembly and the priest face together toward the altar) symbolizes a common pilgrimage toward God. Attentive toward the place where God dwells, we imitate those wise virgins who await the bridegroom's return. St. Matthew tells us He will, at last, appear like lightning shining from the east (Mt. 24:27).
