SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Please take moment to notice all the great things happening at our parish in this late summertime. Today, July 23rd, we have the pancake breakfast and presentation by Dr. Kwasniewski, Next Sunday, we have sung Vespers and Benediction at 4pm. The first weekend of August brings with it White Linen Night, an opportunity for us to give tours of the church and evangelize the revelers. Then, August 6th, our young adults are invited to our next Answers & Appetizers for a discussion with Malise Harold, a Catholic licensed counselor. Altar servers and our parish choirs for adults and children are preparing to start trainings for the fall. Get involved! Join in!

I continue today to highlight the book [A Forest of Symbols](#) by Abbé Barthe. Today let us consider the sacred ministers of a High Mass, the Subdeacon, Deacon and Priest. Taken together, the three sacred ministers all represent Christ, who, in the liturgy, is acting in our midst. Their unity is shown by the fact that they wear similar sacred garb and sit on a simply bench with no back, the sedilia.

However, being three, they also represent Christ: “yesterday, today, and forever.” The subdeacon stands for Christ “yesterday,” or the Old Testament where Christ is proclaimed in type and prophecy. The Subdeacon takes the lowest place among the sacred ministers, walking in front of the others and standing to the left.

The Deacon stands for the New Testament, that is, Christ among us, “today.” This is made clear when the Deacon proclaims the Gospel and takes the place of honor at the right.

The Priest stands for Christ “forever” in that the priest is privileged to make present the very function which Christ perpetually carries out before the throne of the Father. In other words, inaugurated by His death on the Cross, Christ is perpetually offering His perfect sacrifice of love before the Father in Heaven, the sacrifice of His Body and Blood. This same Offering is made present upon our altar by the prayer of the Priest, and It too is offered to the Father in union with the eternal, living and glorious Christ; this is a power the Priest has only by the grace of Holy Orders. This power is properly exercised not casually, but must be adorned by the rich symbols and devotions contained in holy liturgy.

When we watch the action of the Priest, we see him stationed upon the top step of the sanctuary. This signifies for us the mount of the transfiguration, the mount of the beatitudes, and the mount of Golgotha. On his back, the priest wears the chasuble to represent the sweet and gentle yolk of our Lord: the “burden” of charity. Most commonly, it is decorated with some form of the cross. The cross on the chasuble reminds the congregation that the priest is standing *in persona Christi capitis*: the Priest takes Christ’s place as the one who carries the cross for the salvation of the many. ~Fr.
