SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

I was so encouraged to see how many people were able to join us last weekend for our pancake breakfast and presentation by Dr. Kwasniewski. I'm deeply grateful to our men's club, the St. Joseph's Guild, and our donors, for providing the breakfast despite the tor-rential weather!

Continuing my review of A Forest of Symbols, I would like to draw your attention to use of fire and the use of stone. The altar itself is adorned with candles and made from particular materials. We might think that these choices are made for the purpose of decoration only. However, these too, contain important symbolism. Whether we reflect on the six altar candles of a high Mass, the sanctuary lamp, or the two candles carried by the acolytes, these are signs of Christ Himself. Revelation 21:23 says "The Lamb is the lamp" of the heavenly city. The Exultet recalls that the wax which our candles burn is made by chaste mother bees. The wax therefore symbolizes His flesh, born of a Virgin, the flame then communicates the mystery where humanity and divinity unite to make known the Light of the World. (Jn 8:12) This is the reason that a lamp is always burning before the Eucharist contained in a tabernacle. As Abbé Barthe explains, "The wax is thus the most expressive sign of the presence of the divinity in the Holy Sacrament..."

As they burn, both wax and incense evoke for us sacrificial imagery fitting for the Sacrifice of the Mass. We can look upon the many grains of incense as a representation of the many people assembled in the church. Incense grains are imposed into the burning coals of the thurible like the people offer themselves into the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Who is the "Burning Furnace of Charity." The union of heat with the offering signifies the union of our prayers with the prayers of Christ to make a perfect sacrifice fitting to ascend to the Father in Heaven.

Not only the candles, but also the altar is a figure for Christ. Altars have been a sacred sign among God's people for many centuries before Christ. Our Lord is identified by St. Paul as the fulfillment of that miraculous event from the time of the exodus, when a rock followed the Israelites and provided living water in the desert. St. Paul says, "And the rock was Christ." (1 Cor 10:4) The stone of the altar is consecrated with sacred chrism and marked with five crosses to evoke our Lord's five wounds. The altar stone contains the relic of saints, who most perfectly exemplified Christ's sacrifice among us. The stone of the altar is covered with three layers of linen. These remind us of the three burial cloths mentioned by St. John when he visited the tomb on Easter morning. (Jn 20:5-7)

Ever since the sixteenth century, it has been customary to mount the tabernacle upon the altar. Tabernacle means "tent" and reminds us of God who "has pitched His tent among us." (Jn 1:14) It also evokes the golden container of manna collected from God's miraculous providence to His people exiled during Moses' time. ~Fr. O
